

Brooklyn Victory Streak Halted By Bucky Walters

Bucky Walters, once a mediocre fielder, deserves to be rated right now as the best hurler in the National league and quite possibly the best man in the "clutch" in any league. He also is a good man with his bat, when necessary.

Bucky stopped the nine-game winning streak of the Brooklyn Dodgers yesterday.

With the score tied at 1-1, the Dodgers loaded the bases with two out in the ninth inning on Medwick's double and two walks, one intentional. But Walters just took his time and struck out Cosearrat to send the game into extra innings.

In the 11th, after two were out, Walters stretched a hit to center field into a double with a daring slide and scored on a single by Joost. When the Dodgers again loaded the bases in their half of the inning on two singles and a walk, Walters never wavered. He fanned two lefthanded pinch-hitters to end the game.

The defection of the Dodgers gave the St. Louis Cardinals an opportunity to increase their first place margin with a 5-0 triumph over the New York Giants.

The veteran Warnecke kept nine hits well scattered.

In the only other National league game the Pittsburgh Pirates overwhelmed the Phillies 15-2, with Bauers pitching five-hit ball.

Cleveland Keeps Winning.
The Cleveland Indians kept their winning string intact at seven games by outslugging the Philadelphia Athletics by a 13-8 score. Feller held the A's to eight hits, but two of them were homers and one by Bob Johnson came with the bases loaded. Feller hit a home run himself with two on as part of Cleveland's 18-hit offensive.

It was a big-hitting day in the American league with the exception of Washington's 7-0 shutout of the Chicago White Sox.

The Boston Red Sox battered the Detroit Tigers 15-9 in a spectacular session that included 20 hits by Boston and 13 by Detroit, one of them homers. These teams had put together 31 hits the day before.

The New York Yankees, who bombarded the St. Louis Browns with 14 hits on Wednesday, increased the shelling to 17 safeties yesterday and won 14-5. Keller drove in seven runs, getting a homer and a triple, while Joe Gordon made four hits for the second consecutive day. Bonham was able to coast to his third victory.

Consumer Buying Slash as Defense Aid Suggested

WASHINGTON, May 1.—(AP)—Chairman Marriner S. Eccles of the federal reserve board declared today that in the interest of financing and expediting the defense program the public should cut down on purchases of automobiles, houses and other consumer goods.

In a speech to the United States chamber of commerce, Eccles endorsed the treasury objectives of raising \$3,500,000,000 in new taxes, saying that this not only would help bear the costs of defense but, like a cut in the purchases of consumer goods, would also act as a brake on inflationary tendencies.

Further, Eccles suggested that the government "should consider the advisability of providing a method of controlling the volume of forward buying on installment credit."

"Further expansion of installment credit at this time would be an inflationary factor," Eccles said. "Installment credit has tended to expand as employment and payrolls expanded and to contract when both were declining. It has thus tended to be an unstabilizing influence on the economy when it might have been a stabilizing influence."

Eccles opposed imposition of a general sales tax saying "it would fall heaviest on those least able to pay."

On the other hand he said "selective sales taxes which would have the effect of reducing demands for certain products such as automobiles and mechanical refrigerators" were "justifiable and necessary."

Native of Yoncalla Dies at Ellensburg

YONCALLA, May 2.—Word has been received from Ellensburg, Wash., of the death of Charles R. Westenheiser, Wednesday, April 23. He was stricken while helping load a truck of furniture and death followed in a few minutes.

Mr. and Mrs. Westenheiser had moved to Satsop in Grays Harbor county two weeks ago and he had returned with his son, C. L. Westenheiser to move his furniture.

He was born in Yoncalla, January 12, 1866, and lived there until June, 1907, when he moved to Grangeville, Idaho. He also lived in Clearwater and Lewiston, Idaho, before moving to Ellensburg in 1932. He farmed until his retirement in 1932, when he spent a great deal of his time in hunting and fishing.

Increased Water Rates On West Lumber Stayed

WASHINGTON, May 1.—(AP)—The interstate commerce commission has suspended proposed increases in the water rates for coastwise transportation of lumber and other forest products between points in California, Oregon and Washington.

Schedules were filed by the Pacific Lumber Carriers' association proposing the increases. They would have become effective today.

Typical of the proposed increases were the following:
Fir lumber between Seattle and San Francisco, \$7 to \$7.50 per 1,000 board feet; fir logs between the same points, \$8 to \$8.50 per 1,000 board feet; shingles, \$6.50 to \$7.

The commission said it would investigate the proposed increases to decide whether they would be allowed to become effective in the future.

Tax Pre-Payment Plan Studied by Treasury

WASHINGTON, May 1.—(AP)—Secretary Morgenthau announced today the treasury was "working on a plan" to enable citizens to prepay their taxes under the heavy rates being considered by congress.

He said he could not give details, but generally the treasury was thinking of selling a special kind of security which could be used by taxpayers to pay their taxes instead of paying cash.

Thus, a man expecting to pay \$120 income tax could prepare himself by buying a \$10 security every month of the preceding year. When the time came around he would turn over the securities, and avoid the necessity of borrowing money or disturbing his

personal budget in order to meet his tax bill.

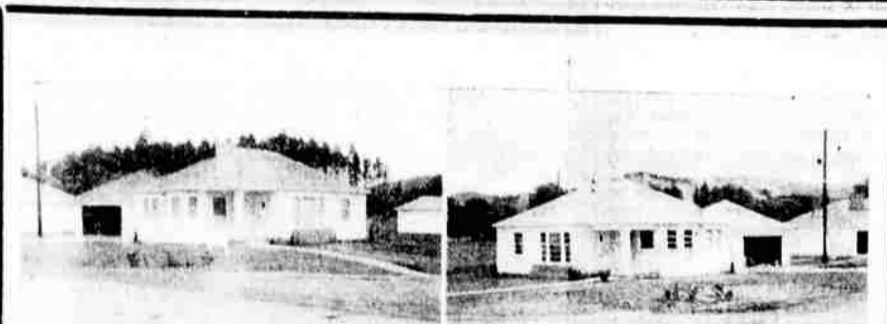
