

Hostak Blasts Out Win Over Sabatino In First Round

Referee Halts Bout After 7th Knockdown; Matthews Defeats Peterson by Technical K. O.

By GAIL FOWLER SEATTLE, May 7.—(AP)—Manager Joe Herman had an oxygen tank in his corner last night for his negro fighter, Attilio Sabatino of Puerto Rico, to sniff from between rounds. But Herman never got to use it.

Sabatino bounced canvasward seven times before the flailing fists of Al Hostak, former NBA middleweight champion, ere the battle was stopped and Hostak awarded a technical kayo in 2:36 of the first round of the scheduled 10-rounder.

Hostak came in at 161 1/2 pounds for his last home town fight before leaving for Chicago and a title match with NBA champion Tony Zale, who beat Hostak for the crown, May 28. Sabatino scaled 158.

Harry "Kid" Matthews, of Emmett, Idaho, scored a four-round technical knockout over Buddy Peterson, former Oregon middleweight champion from Salem, in what was to have been an eight rounder.

Buddy Peterson Beaten. The sturdy Peterson troubled Matthews in the first but ran afoul of a right hand to take a nine count in the second. In the third Peterson was down for nine and eight counts and some how managed to weather the round. Still on his heels in the fourth, the fight was stopped as he backed giddily and helplessly into the ropes with Matthews in pursuit. Peterson weighed 153, Matthews 161.

The show stealer of the card was an eight rounder between heavyweights Al Hoesman, negro soldier from Fort Lewis, and Irish Danny Dowling of St. Louis, Mo. Hoesman, 198 1/2, won the decision with a fast and clever display over Dowling, 197 1/2. There were no knockdowns in the battle, which was as fast as most middleweight scraps.

Other results: Lefty Abbott, 156, Bellingham, Wash., outpointed Soldier Harris, 161 1/2, Fort Lewis negro, in four rounds.

Tenny Talbot, 137, Seattle, outpointed Young Lista, 138, Manila Filipino, in the four-round opener.

At San Francisco last night, the Seals of the Pacific coast league found themselves confronted with Liska and bowed to Portland, 8-4. 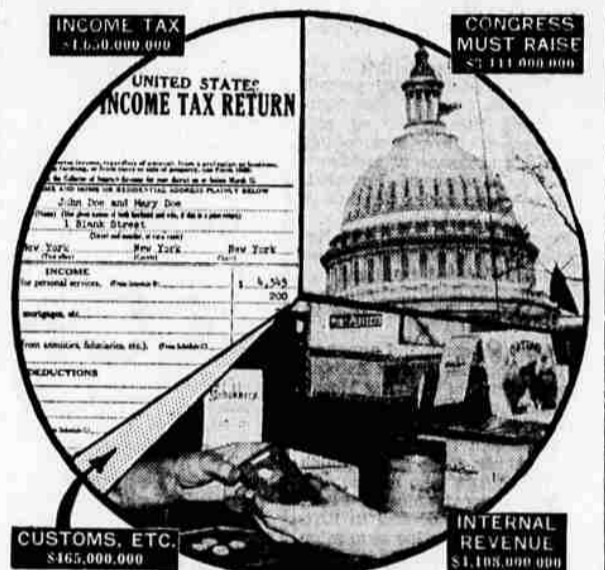
Seattle won 6-5 from San Diego in 11 innings.

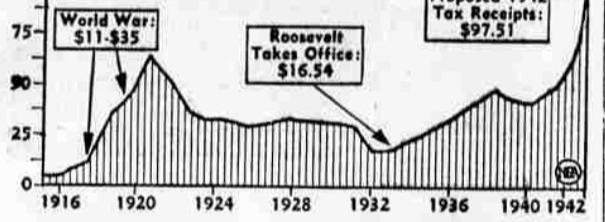

Victory Strings Of Cardinals, Indians Finally Snapped

The St. Louis Cardinals and Cleveland Indians are at the crossroads today, their winning streaks shattered and their pursuers confronting them face to face.

After winning 11 games in a row the Indians tripped over the Washington Senators yesterday 5-3 and the Cardinals' ten-game string was snapped at Boston by the Braves, 5-4. In each case errors were responsible for the defeat.

The Tribe was stopped through a two-base error by Keltner. Jim Bagby and Dutch Leonard were locked in a tight pitching duel with the score tied 2-2 at the start of the eighth. With two out the Senators loaded the bases on two singles and a walk. Then Keltner let a bouncer by Ben Chapman go

through him for two bases and two runs.

Greenberg Enters Army. In the only other American league game the Detroit Tigers nursed their incipient winning streak to five games and moved into second place with a 7-4 conquest of the Yankees as a farewell gesture to Hank Greenberg.

The highest-salaried, most valuable player in the American league was to be inducted into the army today and he paid his last respects to the 1941 baseball season by belting two home runs, the first he had hit in 15 games. Campbell also punched out a pair of round-trippers and Gorsica pitched five-hit ball.

The Cardinals outthit the Braves 11 to 6 and had a two-run lead until the bottom fell out in a five-run fifth inning.

The Dodgers celebrated their acquisition of Billy Herman by pummeling the Pittsburgh Pirates 7-3. Dixie Walker got two home runs, including one with the bases loaded to break a tie in the seventh, Medwick hit a circuit drive with one on, and Herman, who had been batting .194 for the Chi-

cago Cubs, treated himself to a perfect day at bat with a double and three singles. The Cubs were crushed for the tenth time in 12 games as the New York Giants triumphed 5-3 on the four-hit hurling of Hubbell. Hub fed a three-run homer to Leiber in the first inning, then settled down to a masterpiece of pitching.
