The total state call to date, including the men drawn for the month of June, is 2,638, of which approximately 30 per cent are from Multnomah county.

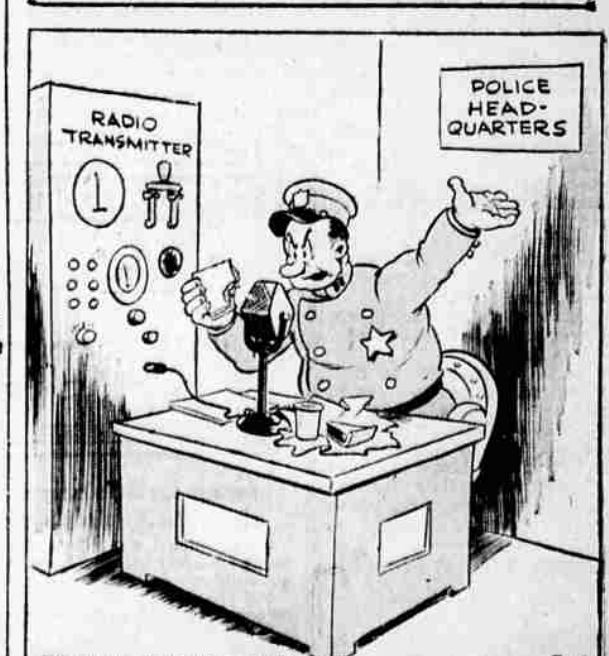
