Benediction—Rev. John A. Barney.



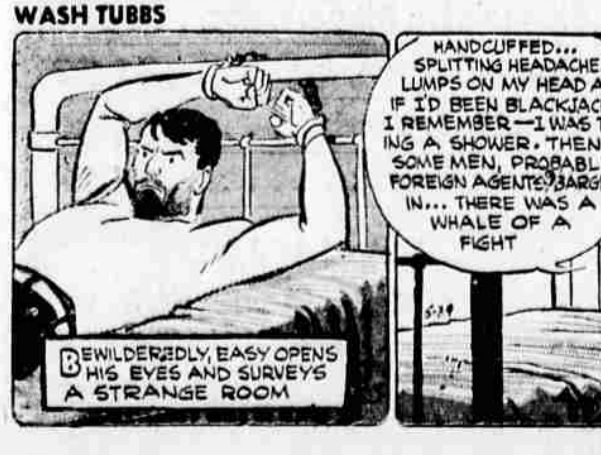
Disturbance Aft
