numerous other items. All of the ports for which the ship was headed are in Portugal and British Africa.

U. S. Action in Abeyance Several days ago, Early said, President Roosevelt would prefer that judgment be suspended on the Robin Moor's fate until after the facts are established.

Today, after Welles read the report, Early said:

"There no longer seems to be any reason to reserve judgment."

Welles refused to indicate what action the United States would take.

He said he expected a comprehensive report during the day and that this would receive the fullest consideration by the government.

When asked whether there was any indication of a German warning before the ship was sunk, he said he could make no further comment until the full report was received.

Welles was asked whether the government on the basis of the preliminary report took a "grave view" of the incident, but he again replied that he had no comment.

air war, German night raiders pounded the British isles in the heaviest attacks in weeks and scattered thousands of propaganda leaflets over the English countryside declaring England faces starvation "this year or the beginning of next."

Nazi warplanes were reported over London, the midlands, the northwest and the north of England. "In one district, it is feared a large number of casualties may have been caused," a communique said.

RAF warplanes were no less busy. Streaking across the channel in strong formations, the British attacked the Ruhr industrial centers of Duisburg and Duesseldorf, bombed the docks at

nazi-held Rotterdam, The Netherlands, and roared down the French coast to strike at Calais, Boulogne and German gun emplacements at Cap Gris Nez.

The flames of bursting bombs lighted the Calais waterfront, it was reported, and buildings 21 miles across the channel in Dover, England, shook with the repercussion.

Hitler's high command admitted Germans were killed and wounded overnight in RAF attacks on Cologne, Duisburg and Bochum, Germany, where "severe destruction" of apartment houses was noted. No casualty figures were given.

In the battle of the Atlantic, the Germans claimed that Britain's 31,000-ton battleship Malaya and the 32,000-ton battle cruiser Repulse had been put out of action indefinitely by Nazi U-boat

torpedoes.

Blows Dealt in Africa.

On the African front, the British news agency Reuters reported that Assab, second port of Italian Eritrea, had fallen to the British. Most of the colony was taken by empire forces in April.

In North Africa, Premier Mussolini's high command reported, Italian long-range guns have been pounding day and night at the siege-bound British garrison at Tobruk, Libya.

Tobruk harbor was described as a wreck-littered "graveyard" of British ships sunk by axis bombers, and the Italians asserted that only small craft could now enter the harbor because of the sunken hulks.

Soviet Said Menaced.

In the British capital, meanwhile, usually reliable sources reported receipt of information that

the Germans were massing troops, artillery and aircraft in occupied Poland and Rumania for a "war of nerves" designed to wrest concessions from Soviet Russia.

These reports, similar to others made public in Ankara, Turkey, just a week ago, coincided with the arrival in London of Sir Stafford Cripps, British ambassador to Moscow.

London sources speculated that the Nazi demands revolved around oil and the great wheat areas of the Ukraine.

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, June 12.—(AP)—Britain's famous gunboat Ladybird, 625 tons, and the monitor Terror whose 15-inch guns helped shatter Italy's shore defenses in Libya, have been sunk by Stuka dive bombers, the British navy announced today.

The 8,000-ton Terror was caught at dusk recently off the Libyan coast and made the target for 500-pound bombs. Her big and small guns put up a terrific barrage, causing the Germans to miss, but a near miss crumpled

the Monitor amidships.

The Ladybird went down in Tobruk harbor, Libya, "burning like hell" and firing against the screaming Stukas until her last dry gun slipped under the water, it was said.
