

Flying Teacher Sink Will Head Redmond School

Leaving behind a record of 86 aviation students who have been passed through the solo stage, with 19 already holding private pilot licenses, Ernest L. (Red) Sink, who for the past two years has served as instructor at the local airport, will leave with his family Thursday to locate at Redmond.

Mr. Sink returned to Roseburg last night from Portland, where he has been spending the past two weeks taking an advanced course in aerobatics and being re-examined for his instructor's rating. He has been given a renewal of contract for a year under the Civilian Pilot Training program, and has been assigned to complete the school now in progress at Redmond and start a new school in that area.

The school in eastern Oregon is training students from Bend, Redmond and Prineville. Sixteen students now are ready for flight training, having completed their ground school, and a new class is to start ground school immediately.

Mr. Sink recently completed a similar school for the Roseburg area.

Local Service Notable

He came to Roseburg nearly two years ago and assisted in organizing the Umpqua Flying club, believed to be the largest independent flying club in the United States. More than 150 students were enrolled at various times in the local club and more than 70 completed dual instruction and passed solo tests. The Roseburg Flying club also was organized recently and a plane purchased in order that more flying time could be acquired by solo students.

During his period of flight instruction here Mr. Sink has had approximately 1,100 hours in the air with students.

So far no arrangements have been made for additional instruction here, but it is reported that plans soon will be worked out for a competent person to locate here to care for club planes and superintend civilian flying activities at the airport. It is expected the flying program this summer will be curtailed due to reconstruction work at the field and that army activities will in some measure conflict with civilian flying following the completion of the improvements program.

Louis, Conn End Training For Tomorrow's Battle

NEW YORK, June 17. (AP)—Their training completed, Billy Conn and Joe Louis were scheduled to take things mutually easy today, resting up in preparation for tomorrow night's championship battle.

Most of Conn's backing stems from the fact that Billy as a middleweight and a light-heavyweight turned in a brilliant and unbroken string of victories. The hard truth remains that tomorrow's fight brings together a fine little man, whose ability to stand against even a top-ranking heavy-weight has yet to be proved, and a great, big man who for four years has slaughtered all comers.

The fight "experts" pick Louis over Conn, but the surprise of their voting today was that the Brown Bomber was only a 2 to 1 choice.

An Associated Press poll of the fight writers gathering for Joe's 18th defense of the heavyweight crown showed that of 33 casting ballots, 11 picked Conn and 22 rode along with the head man.

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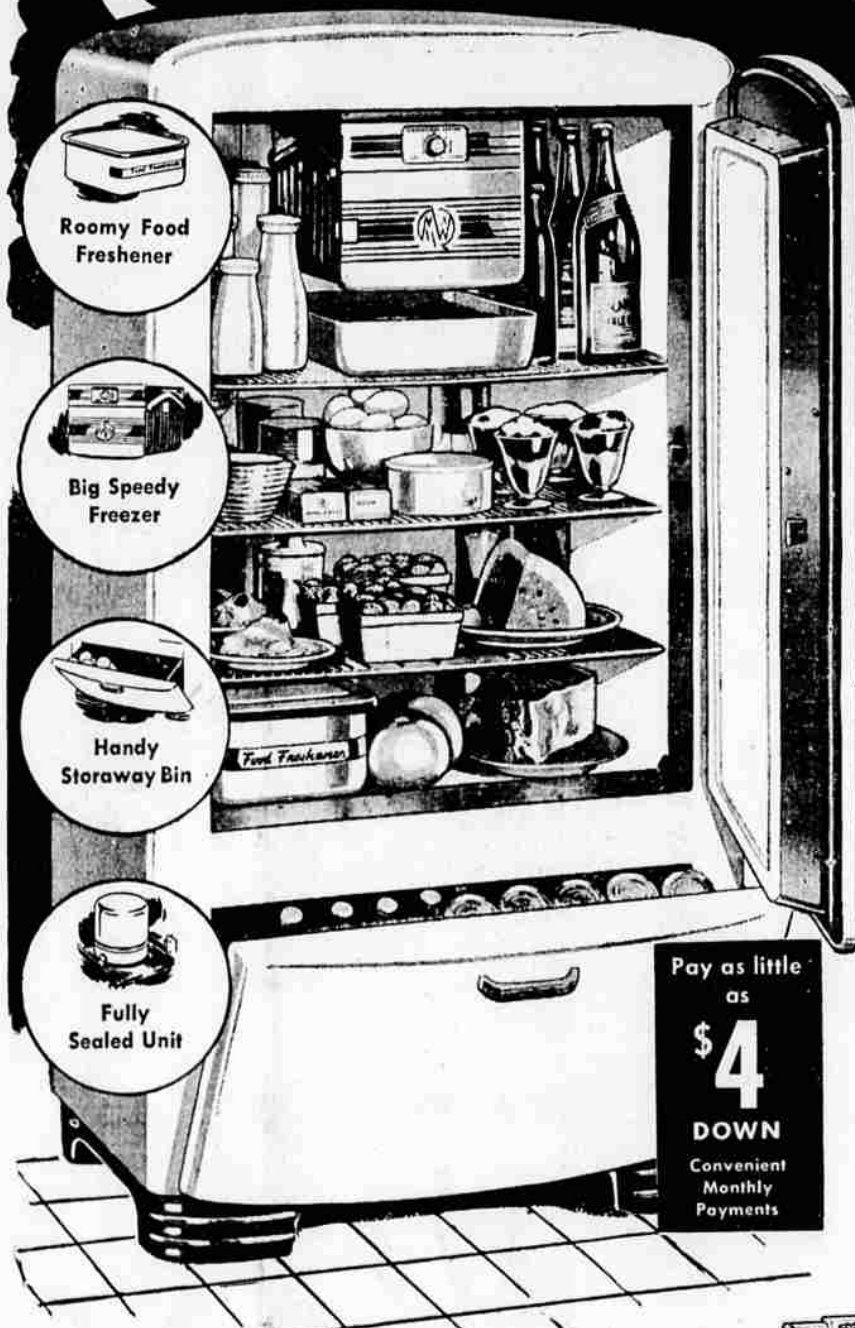
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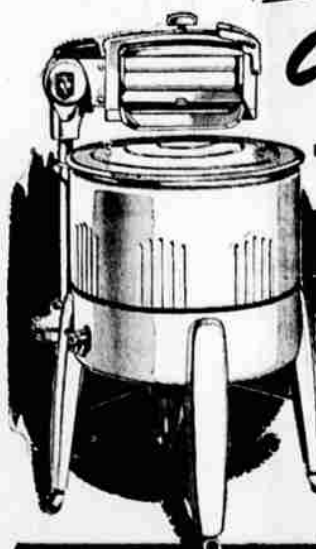
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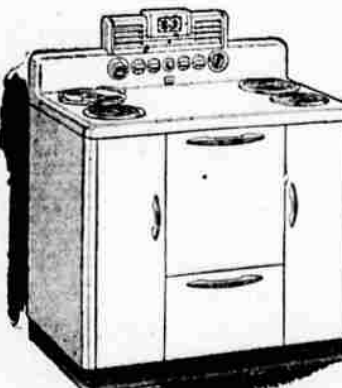


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
