New Class in Job Adjustment Being Organized Here

A new class in job adjustment and application is being organized this week at the Roseburg Junior high school building. It was announced today by W. M. Campbell, school superintendent. This class is the third organized under the national defense training program in Roseburg. Two classes in the spring offered instruction in sheet metal and auto mechanics, under the direction of Homer W. Grow.

Any high school graduate between ages of 17 and 24 is eligible to attend this job adjustment class, though it is primarily intended for youth interested in clerical work or salesmanship. The class will meet from 1:30 to 5:30 p. m. from Monday through Friday for a period of eight weeks.

The classes are jointly sponsored by the local school board, the state vocational department and the national youth administration. Scott Williams has been secured as instructor for the course. All young people interested are asked to see Mr. Williams or Supt. Campbell at the Junior high school Wednesday, July 2, at 1:30 p. m.

CALL FOR BIDS

Written and sealed bids will be received by and including July 9, 1941, for the transportation of pupils of the Non-High School District and Union High School District No. 5 of Douglas County, Oregon, to high schools of the following named districts in said County, and for the hereinafter named established transportation routes, to-wit:

District No. 4—Roseburg Wilbur Route—approximately 15 miles one way, 15 passenger bus required. Bids for next ensuing 5 years requested.

District No. 8—Canyonville Gazley Route—Sedan only required. Bids for ensuing 1 year requested.

Each successful bidder will be required to furnish a motor bus which will periodically pass State Police inspection and which will conform to all rules and regulations of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Oregon. Each successful bidder will be required to furnish, at his own expense, public liability and property damage insurance policies acceptable to the County Education Board, in accordance with the number of pupils to be transported, as follows: 5 or under—\$10,000 and \$20,000 public liability; Over 5 and not to exceed 10—\$10,000 and \$30,000 public liability; Over 10, \$10,000 and \$100,000 public liability; In all cases \$5,000 property damage. Compensation under contracts awarded hereunder will be made on a monthly basis, with four weeks of school of five days each constituting a month. Payment will be made, however, only for days upon which transportation actually is furnished when school is in session, excepting in the case of legal school holidays, for which payment will be made. Each bidder is required to submit two copies of his bid on or before the date above stated, one to the undersigned Clerk of the County Education Board, and the other to the clerk of the school district to which transportation is to be furnished. Bids will be opened at a meeting of the County Education Board at the Douglas County Court House, Roseburg, Oregon, on July 10, 1941, at 10:00 o'clock A. M. Contracts will be awarded in each case to the lowest bidder deemed responsible by the County Education Board taking into consideration the recommendations of the Boards of the School Districts affected. The right is reserved, however, to reject any and all bids. Complete specifications and information as to location and length of routes and number of pupils to be transported may be obtained either from the undersigned or from the clerk of the High School Districts involved. 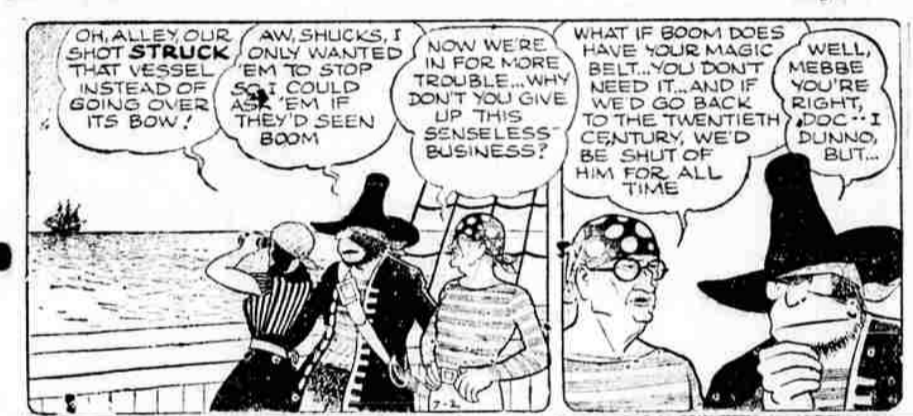
IN BANKRUPTCY

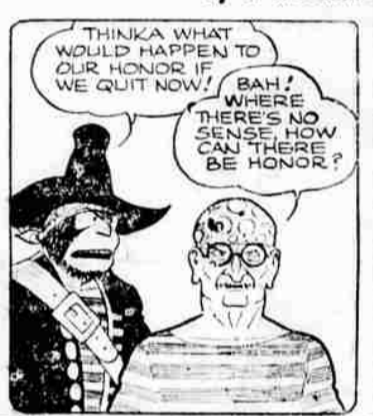

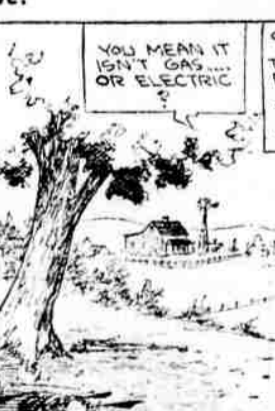
