

Rainiers Defeat Portland, Padres Trim Sacramento

Ad Liska, the little Portland submariner, was wild last night and the Seattle Rainiers chalked up their second straight victory over the Beavers 7-2 to advance one step nearer the Pacific coast league pace-setting Sacramento Solons.

For the second consecutive time the San Diego Padres, who are close on the heels of the second place Rainiers, set the Solons back 4-1.

The Padres hammered Turberville for the deciding three runs in the ninth inning in Sacramento after Freitas had held them to one hit for eight frames.

San Francisco advanced a notch in the standings by beating Oakland 7-3. The Seals replaced Los Angeles by a fractional margin in the fifth spot.

Hollywood tightened its hold on fourth place by walloping Los Angeles for the second straight time 8-2. The Stars clouted 14 hits from three Angel hurlers while Bithorn gave up only three safe blows.

Noted Minister Of Presbyterian Church Dated Here

The Rev. Donald Grey Barnhouse, D. D., will be the guest preacher at the First Presbyterian church, Roseburg, Sunday, July 13. Rev. M. H. Roach, pastor, reported today. The Rev. Dr. Barnhouse is a prominent minister in Philadelphia, Pa., where he has served the Tenth Presbyterian church for a number of years. Mrs. Barnhouse and the children are accompanying Dr. Barnhouse as he fills his speaking engagements on the Pacific coast. After completing a Bible conference schedule in Portland, Dr. Barnhouse and family will spend several days at Crater and Diamond lake, before continuing to Roseburg for the three Sunday services.

The Rev. Dr. Barnhouse is a man of many talents, Rev. Roach reports. Besides his busy city pastorate he is engaged as a Bible conference speaker, edits a Bible magazine, and is author of several books. Many churches of various denominations call upon his ability as a popular preacher, and he is engaged from coast to coast by the summer Bible conferences. The monthly magazine, "Revelation," which Dr. Barnhouse edits, is one of the leading Christian periodicals in the country. Among the books which Dr. Barnhouse has written are "His Own Received Him Not But," "God's Methods for Holy Living," "Life by His Son," and "Teaching the Word of Truth."

Dr. Barnhouse will preach at the First Presbyterian church three times on Sunday: the morning service at 11 o'clock, the afternoon service at 3 o'clock, and the evening service at 8. A portion of the afternoon service will be broadcast over KRNH in the Angelus Hour which is conducted each Sunday by Dr. C. A. Edwards.

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Forest Protective Assn. to Increase Fire Guard Force

The Douglas Forest Protective Association will add 20 men to its regular force during the fire season. It was announced today by H. G. Pargeter, secretary. Funds appropriated by the federal government to aid in protection of western forests against fire, will be used to pay the cost of the increase in personnel, needed because of a possible increased hazard from sabotage. The increased protection for forests is a part of the defense program.

A five-man standby crew will be located at Sutherlin and another of similar size will be stationed at Drain, Mr. Pargeter reported. A 10-man crew will be stationed at Days Creek and a supplementary lookout will be placed at Bland mountain in the South Umpqua district.

When not employed in actual fire fighting and patrol duty, the men will be used to improve trails and clear roadside hazards on county roads. Mr. Pargeter reports. The crews at Sutherlin and Drain will clean brush and grass from county road rights-of-ways in those areas, working in cooperation with the county court.
