Cantonment Involves Road, Stirs Grants Pass

GRANTS PASS, July 19.—(AP)—Charles R. Cooley, president of the Grants Pass chamber of commerce, said he would have a chamber committee investigate the proposal for abandonment of part of the Sams valley road between Gold Hill and the Crater lake highway to make way for a projected Rogue river valley cantonment. The silver state highway is all in Jackson county.

Cooley said he was especially interested to learn if there will be an alternate route. Abandonment of any part of the highway would mean increasing the distance from Grants Pass to Crater lake from 103 miles via Gold Hill to 112 miles via Medford. It might also return to Medford a place on the west side Crater lake bus schedule. More than a year ago the lake resort management transferred its terminal from Medford to Grants Pass, and sent its buses over the shorter route, via Gold Hill.
