Beavers Conquer Sacs Twice; Turpin Wins Over Padres

The once mighty Sacramento Senators continued their rapid downhill descent in Pacific coast league baseball practice yesterday—their decline assisted by a shove from the lowly Portland Beavers.

The Beavers copped both ends of a double header, 7 to 1, and 8 to 2, behind the pitching of Liska in the opener and Reid in the nightcap.

Loop-leading Sacramento and cellar-berthed Portland split the series, three games each, with Sacramento's lead over second-place San Diego now trimmed to seven and a half games.

San Diego and Seattle split their double-header, Seattle taking the first, 7 to 2, and dropping the second, 3 to 1. San Diego took the series, three games to two.

Hal Turpin pitched his 13th victory of the season by winning the first game for Seattle. The results of the series left the northern team trailing the Padres by a game and a half.

Hollywood lost both games of its doubleheader with Oakland, 5

to 4 in 11 innings and 5 to 2 in seven despite the double loss, the Stars won the series, 4 games to 3.

Corbett did the hurling for the Oaks in the overtime opener and kept 12 hits scattered enough so that they were ineffective. Salverson held the Stars to six hits in the nightcap.

San Francisco and Los Angeles split their doubleheader, the Seals dropping the first, 1 to 0 in 13 innings, and winning the second, 7 to 5.

The Angels won the series, 5 games to 2.

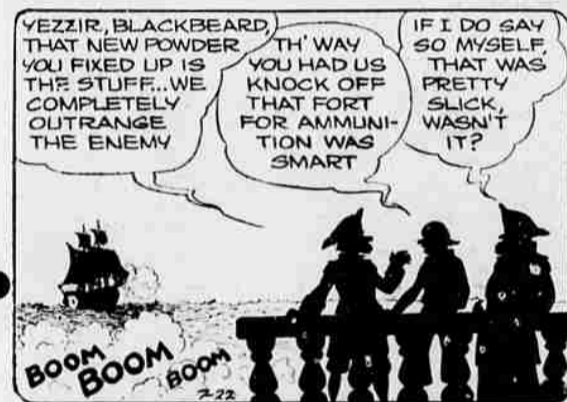

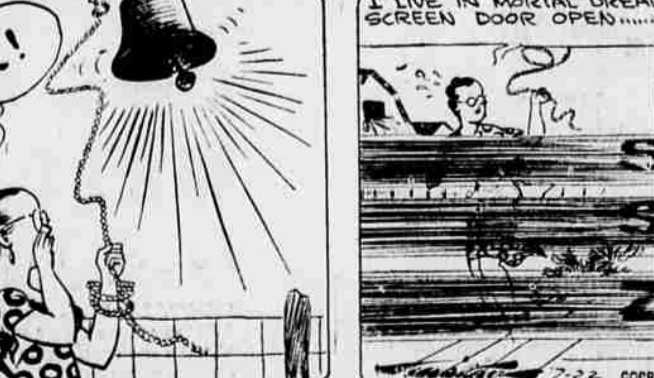

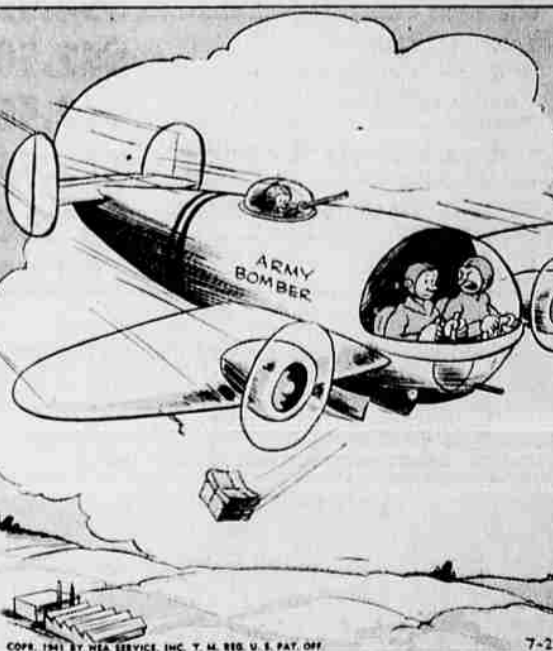
