Mayor LaGuardia Seeks Third Term

NEW YORK, July 22.—(AP)—New York's political battle lines were drawn today with Mayor F. H. La Guardia seeking a third term in office and one of the nation's best known crusading prosecutors, William O'Dwyer of Brooklyn, favored by the opposition.

The busy mayor, dividing his time between New York and his Washington office as director of civilian defense, announced his candidacy in a talk last night with the avowed support of the fusion party that sent him to city hall in 1933 and 1937 and the American labor party.

He declared he definitely would not enter the democratic primary against O'Dwyer but let it be known that he would accept the republican nomination provided the GOP endorsement also was given to his present city controller, Joseph D. McGoldrick, and City Council President Newbold Morris.

Thus, while the way still was clear for the republicans to nominate a third candidate, political observers considered that course unlikely and looked upon La Guardia and O'Dwyer as the final opponents for election after uncontested primaries.

G. O. P. Must Get Rid of "Die-Hards," Leader Says

PORTLAND, July 21.—(AP)—The republican party must gain the support of labor and get rid of the "old die-hards in congress," Gordon Allott, Lamar, Colo., said here Saturday.

The chairman of the National Young Republican federation told northwest G.O.P. members that President Roosevelt had lost contact with party leaders and as a result the republican party offered youth a greater chance to advance and "be somebody" in politics.

He added that friction between the Young Republican federation and the senior party organization had disappeared in the last few months.
