Veteran Pulls Walnut Trains

STOCKTON, Calif.—(AP)—Built in 1867 and believed to be the oldest locomotive in the country, old No. 1 of the Stockton Terminal and Eastern Railroad still is in daily service. During the year it hauls about \$1,000,000 worth of walnuts between this point and the towns of Linden and Bellota.

PROCLAMATION

AREA NO. 15-P. COOS AND DOUGLAS COUNTIES PATROL UNIT.

Township 22 South, Range 8 West: Sections 30, 31, 32 & 33.
Township 22 South, Range 9 West: Sections 21 to 28 and 33 to 36, inclusive.
Township 23 South, Range 8 West: Sections 4 to 9, inclusive; Sections 16 to 21, inclusive, and Sections 25 to 36, inclusive.
Township 23 South, Range 9 West: Sections 1 to 4, 8 to 17, 21 to 29, 31 to 36, inclusive.
Township 24 South, Range 8 West: All of Township.
Township 24 South, Range 9 West: All of Township.
Township 24 South, Range 10 West: Sections 1 to 4, 9 to 16, 20 to 29, 32 to 36, inclusive.
Township 25 South, Range 7 West: That portion of Sections 7 and 8 lying south of the Umpqua River; all of Sections 17 and 18; that portion of Sections 19, 20 & 30 lying north and west of the divide between the Cougar Creek and Hubbard Creek watersheds.

Township 25 South, Range 8 West: All of Township.
Township 25 South, Range 9 West: All of Township.
Township 25 South, Range 10 West: Sections 1 to 5 and 7 to 36, inclusive.
Township 26 South, Range 7 West: All that portion lying west of the divide between the Umpqua River and Hubbard Creek watersheds.
Township 26 South, Range 8 West: All of Township.
Township 26 South, Range 9 West: All of Township.
Township 26 South, Range 10 West: All of Township.
Township 27 South, Range 7 West: Those portions of Sections

1 to 36, inclusive.

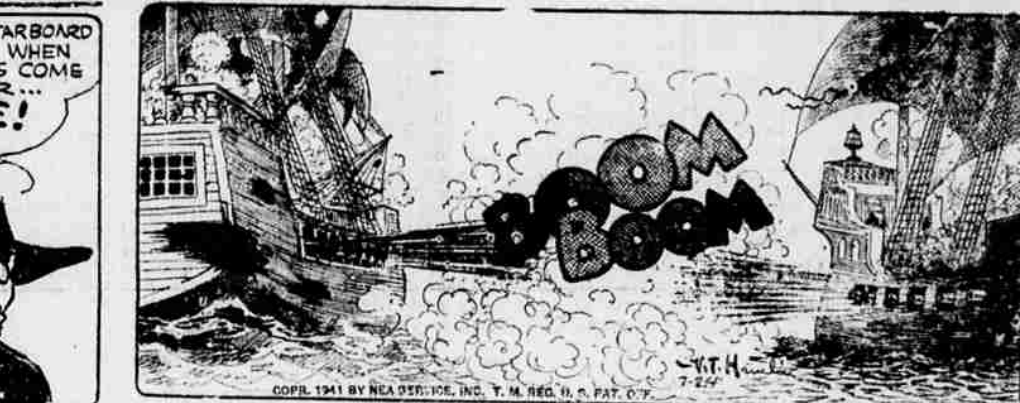
