MAKES THIS FAMOUS OREGON APPLE SAUCE CAKE

APPLE SAUCE CAKE

- 2 c. White Satin sugar
- 1 c. shortening
- 1/2 cup of the unsweetened chocolate
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon allspice
- 2 c. boiling hot apple sauce, unsweetened
- 1 c. chopped walnuts
- 1 egg
- 1 c. flour
- 1 c. raisins or dates
- 1 level teaspoon soda
- 1 teaspoon salt

Mix sugar, shortening, chocolate, spices, walnuts and eggs in bowl; then pour in hot apple sauce; add sifted flour, raisins, soda and salt. Beat well and pour into two medium sized, greased square cake pans. Bake 35 minutes in moderate oven.

Use the following icing to put layers together, and for frosting:

- 1 c. White Satin sugar
- 1 egg white, unbeaten
- 2 c. cold water

Put ingredients in a bowl, and place bowl in larger bowl of boiling water. Beat frosting seven minutes with egg beater. Add 1 teaspoon flavoring.

Brooklyn Breaks Winning Streak Of Elmer Riddle

Cincinnati's Ace Moundsman Beaten 5-4; Cardinals Down Giants in 12-Inning Game

The Brooklyn Dodgers have solved the Riddle, heretofore known as Elmer, the unsolved, and given the Cincinnati Reds their biggest shock of the season. The young righthander had won 11 games without a defeat this season and become a symbol of hope for the beleaguered National league champions.

Last night Riddle gained a 4-0 lead over the groggy Dodgers in the first five frames and looked unbeatable. Then with two resounding salvos Brooklyn came from behind to crush him 5-4 and continue the first place deadlock in the senior circuit.

Frank McCormick, last year's most valuable player in the National league, was knocked out by one of Higbe's fast balls which struck him on the head, but an examination at a hospital showed he had received only a mild concussion and might be able to appear in the lineup tomorrow and preserve his "iron man" string of 549 consecutive games.

Cardinals Defeat Giants.
The St. Louis Cardinals nosed out the New York Giants 5-4 in a 12-inning thriller in an effort to gain exclusive possession of first place.

Warneke held the Giants to two hits for eight innings, but the New Yorkers caught up with him in the ninth and tied the score. However, the Redbirds punched across the winning tally in the 12th on a pair of singles by Crespi and Crabtree to give Ernie White, working one inning in relief, credit for his second victory in two days.

Vince DiMaggio doubled with the bases loaded in the fourth inning of a night game to boost the Pittsburgh Pirates to a 5-2 decision over the Phillies.

Erriekson's seven-hit hurling brought the Boston Braves a 6-1 triumph over the Chicago Cubs.

Yanks Nose Out Indians.
The New York Yankees conquered the Cleveland Indians again 3-2 to draw nine games out in front of the American league pennant race, so called. Russo limited the Indians to five hits and DiMaggio and Keller each hit home runs.

It was the Yankees' fifth straight victory and their 36th in 42 games.

The Chicago White Sox whipped the Boston Red Sox 10-4 with a 17-hit bombardment. A two-run homer by Hayes helped the Philadelphia Athletics nudge the St. Louis Browns 5-4 and move within one percentage point of the fifth place Detroit Tigers, who were humbled for the 10th time in 14 meetings by the Washington Senators, 6-1.
