Presbyterian Property

In China Seized by Japs

SHANGHAI, Aug. 14.—(AP)—Japanese seizure of the American Southern Presbyterian mission hospital and other property of the mission at Tsingkiangpu and the virtual imprisonment of American physicians and missionaries there, was charged here tonight in reports received by Presbyterian mission executives.

Tsingkiangpu is in northern Kiangsu province, in which Shanghai is situated, and the report was brought here by Chinese courier.

Americans at the mission include three men and six women.

The alleged Japanese action was called retaliation for Washington's freezing of Japanese assets in the United States.

The seizure was said to have occurred July 31 when 40 Japanese military police went to the American hospital and forced the Americans to concentrate in a residence on mission property where they since have been held incommunicado.

The report said Chinese physicians and others attached to the mission were held for a while in another residence, but later released.

Bean Pickers Wanted

SALEM, Aug. 14.—(AP)—The state employment service issued a call today for 1,400 workers to pick beans in the Stayton area, asserting that the bean growers would suffer losses unless the pickers are found.

Growers said good weather has increased the crop far above original estimates. Until yesterday, there were more pickers than were needed.

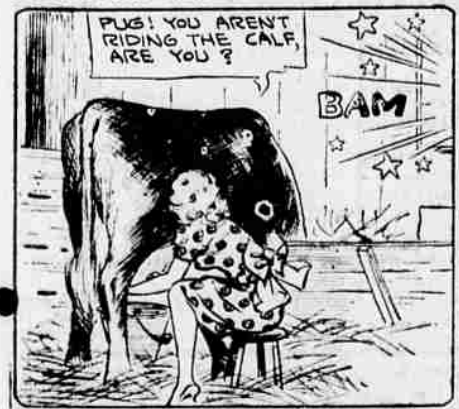
