World's Greatest X-Ray Tube Made For Cancer Eying

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 13.—(AP)—Dr. Clyde K. Emery, physician, said today he and associates have completed the world's most powerful X-ray tube for cancer treatment and research.

The tube, he said, will generate between two and three million volts.

Dr. Emery for eight years aided in conducting cancer clinical work with the million volt tube at the California Institute of Technology. In 1938 Caltech decided to remodel its equipment for atom smashing.

"During these years of research," said Dr. Emery, "we found evidence that certain types of cancer responded better to treatment with high voltage X-rays."

"These were deep seated cancers of the kidneys, bladder and other parts of the body."

"When Caltech decided to turn its tube to other uses, Drs. S. R. Baker and Melville Jacobs and I determined to build the larger tube, which now is in use. We are known as the Emery group."

"We hope the new tube will prove of value in treating certain types of cancer and enable us to learn more about the disease."

Dr. Charles C. Lauritsen, physicist in charge of the Caltech tube, helped design the more powerful one.

The treatment chamber is surrounded by three feet thick concrete walls and lead shields which protect physicians and nurses from cumulative exposure to escaping rays.

The 14-foot porcelain tube is enclosed in a steel tank insulated by highly compressed air.

Payroll Padding, Graft Charged In Defense Program

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 14.—(AP)—The labor situation in southern California aircraft plants, including reports of payroll padding, and "persistent rumors of graft in connection with the establishment of Camp San Luis Obispo" will be investigated here next week by a senate committee on national defense, Sen. Mon C. Wallgren (D-Wash.) announced upon his arrival.

Of payroll padding Senator Wallgren, a member of the committee, said in an interview: "We have heard that such is the case in some instances."

He stated executives of all aircraft plants would be asked to tell "how many planes are being turned out daily and how much each plane costs the taxpayers. We are determined to see to it that the government gets dollar for dollar in aircraft production."

Aircraft manufacturers, Wallgren added, "must let us know where and why the bottlenecks exist. They also must inform us as to labor troubles."

Asserting "the labor situation in the aircraft industry is unstable," he added: "One company will have a closed shop, another an open shop, a third a combination of open and closed shops in various departments. You can't have stabilization of labor under that system, or lack of system."

Morgenthau Would Hoist Social Security Taxes

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—(AP)—Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau today advocated increasing social security taxes for the double purpose of preventing inflation during the emergency and cushioning readjustments later.

The secretary told a press conference the proposal was part of the suggestions he intended to give congressional committees studying price control legislation and other anti-inflation measures.

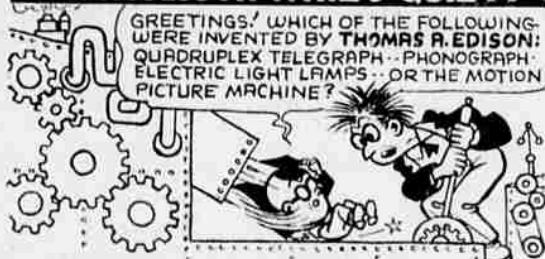
He said he had no details in mind, especially as to how much the tax ought to be increased.

Strife Between Unions Ties Up Clatsop Plant

WHEELER, Aug. 14.—(AP)—CIO International Woodworkers of America, who said they were discharged at the Markham and Calloway, Inc., logging operations in southern Clatsop county because they refused to join an AFL union, placed pickets yesterday that halted operations.

The AFL workers refused to pass the picket line.

The CIO said 32 of their members had been discharged. The AFL Sawmill and Lumber Workers' local has an agreement with the firm requiring loggers to join the union within 15 days after employment.

About 250 men are employed, supplying logs to Warrenton and Portland mills.
