### Sacramento Lead Cut to 5 Games

(By the Associated Press) The long tanding jest that Sacramento might not win the 1941 Coast league baseball championship began to lose some of its lighter touches today.

Beaten three times straight, most recently 5-1, by a second-place Seattle club, the Senators, once proud possessors of a 16-game bulge on their rivals, now find their lead reduced to five games.

Five games, of course, remains a sizable margin, but with 41 weeks and some 30-odd engagements yet to play, the Sacramento certainly must check the rate of their current decline if they expect
