

### Seattle Defeats Portland Behind Turpin's Hurling

(By the Associated Press) The curfew bells rang last night and Portland lost a chance to win the Pacific coast league baseball second game of a doubleheader after losing the first to a ninth-inning, four-run rally of the Seattle Rainiers at Portland.

In the first game the Beavers were leading 5-3 at the start of the ninth but lost to Seattle's rally with the final score, 7-5. In the second they were ahead, 2-0, when league curfew time arrived in the fourth frame and the engagement was ruled no contest.

The single victory gave Seattle a clean record for the two game stand at Portland. Turpin was the winning hurler.
