Japs Launch Honan Drive to Erase Stigma of Defeat

SHANGHAI, Oct. 2—(AP)—The Japanese launched a new offensive in Honan province today, 500 miles north of their Hunan province campaign and apparently aimed, as was the other, at erasing the stigma of an old defeat, suffered in October 1939.

Japanese military dispatches said the invading forces in Honan moved southward across the Yellow and the New Yellow rivers with Chengchow (Chenghsien) as their objective, asserting 120,000 Chinese troops were trapped in the region around Chengchow.

The city is an important junction on the Lunghai and Peiping-Hankow railroads, which traverse Honan from east to west and north to south.

It was in June, 1938, that the Chinese saved Chengchow by dynamiting the dykes of the Yellow river between that city and the capital Kaifeng, flooding a strip of country 10 miles wide.

The altered stream has remained for three years as a barrier to the Japanese.

In Hunan province, the Chinese were reported to have lost 14,000 men in attempting to stop a Japanese raid which had carried into the provincial capital of Changsha.

The Japanese announced yesterday they were withdrawing from the city because "the purpose of the campaign has been accomplished."

In Chungking, Chinese military dispatches reported the Japanese were in full retreat from Changsha with Chinese troops "in hot pursuit, disarming encircled and strayed remnants."

The Japanese were said to be retreating in three columns, one following the Canton-Hankow railway and two following parallel highways.

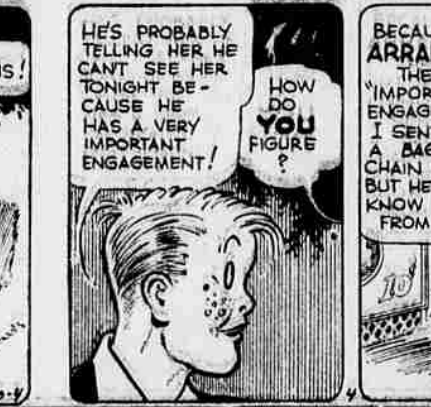
