Wage Increase Granted Million WPA Workers

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10—(AP)—An 8.5 per cent wage increase for almost 1,000,000 WPA workers, effective November 1, was announced yesterday by Howard O. Hunter, work projects commissioner.

A flat \$5.20 a month increase was granted to 834,000 workers who now earn less than \$90 a month, and Hunter said he was working on an increase for workers making over \$90. He indicated no raise would be granted to bring any wage to over \$100 a month.

The increases do not affect 106,300 workers now employed 40 to 48 hours a week on defense projects. The commissioner explained that the income of these workers already had been increased.
