

### Japan's Move In Crisis Subject Of Speculation

For the second time in three months a Japanese government headed by Prince Konoye has resigned, admitting that the world cataclysm presented problems with which it could not deal.

Indications are that intensified crises in Japan's relations with the United States and Russia led to the cabinet's fall.

The military and ultra-patriotic extremists have been clamoring for an end to attempts to conciliate the United States and demanding that the empire be ready to strike at Russia or continue its expansion southward.

Until Konoye's successor is named it will not be clear whether the war party has triumphed. Konoye's resignation may mean the surrender of the elements that have wanted at all costs to avoid war with America, but it also may be just another move in the premier's tortuous course in dealing with the extremists.

The crisis may end with Konoye heading his fourth cabinet or with a general or an admiral in his place.

**Japanese Realize Peril.**  
All Japan's leaders know they are confronted with the danger—a catastrophe for Japan—or war with the United States and Britain if they attack Russia while Hitler is knocking at Moscow's gates or attempt further expansion to the south.

America and Britain are deeply committed to help Russia. Even the militarists probably realize that a Siberian adventure would entail the danger of simultaneous conflict with four great powers, America, Britain, Russia and China.

But they differ from the moderates in a readiness to accept this tremendous gamble.

Seven weeks ago Konoye sent a personal message, still unpublished, to President Roosevelt. The Japanese considered this a gesture of conciliation, and the peace party placed great hopes in it.

Little encouragement was given these hopes in Washington, where American leaders have made it clear that the differences in the policies of the United States, committed to a great effort to crush the axis, and Japan, a member of that alliance, were too fundamental to be wiped out by well-meant words and gestures. "Exploratory" talks were carried on by Secretary Hull and Ambassador Nomura, but no progress has been announced.

Hence hopes of the Japanese moderates have been dying and the aggressive elements have become louder in their clamor for an end to conciliation.

The Japanese say that while the Washington talks continued the United States has increased its participation in the "ABCD" encirclements of Japan—the military preparations of America, Britain, China and Dutch East Indies to block any New Japanese thrusts in southern Asia.

It is entirely true that United States forces in the Philippines have been steadily strengthened and American-made war supplies and other support has gone in an increasing flow to the British at

**Gasoline Refining Near Bottleneck, Ickes Warns**  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 16—(AP)—Petroleum Coordinator Ickes said today a bottleneck of potential seriousness "is appearing" in the nation's gasoline refining capacity.

If it develops as gravely as it might, he said, it would necessitate a quick increase in refining capacity or curtailment of non-essential civilian motor fuel consumption on a nation-wide basis.

Ickes expressed the hope that expansion of refining capacity could obviate any necessity for widespread rationing of gasoline.
