The Roseburg high school Indians will endeavor tonight to knock the Springfield Millers off their perch at the top of the Tri-County high school football league. The strong Springfield team, undefeated so far this season, is expected to give the Indians the hardest test of the season in the game under the lights at Finlay field tonight.

Outstanding players on the visiting team are Doug Frye, veteran from last year's squad, who is an exceptionally good pass receiver and a fine defensive player; John Radmore, center, defensive squad caller, a good blocker and line backer on defense; Ronald McGuire, blocker and strong defense player at right guard; Wayne Seaman, fleet halfback, who can kick, pass and run, and who has scored six touchdowns for the Millers this year, and Lee Todd, quarterback, a speedy ball carrier, a good blocker and an able passer and kicker.

Augmenting this group of stars, is a very capable squad, with a particularly strong line, both on offense and defense.

### Washington Even Choice in Battle With Stanford 11

Oregon State Favored Over Cougars, U. of O. Expected To Easily Defeat UCLA

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 24.—(AP)—Stanford's T formation Indians attempt to bias one of the toughest obstacles from their Rose Bowl path tomorrow when they hook up with a powerful Washington outfit in the Pacific coast's top football game.

With wet weather expected in Seattle for the contest, the champion Stanford was no better than an even choice against the Huskies. Washington, one of the five contenders for the coast conference title, is a proven mudder, while Stanford's only loss this season came in the rain.

The famed Indian T formation probably will be operating without speedy Pete Kmetovic, the hard-running halfback who was instrumental in Stanford's 20-to-10 victory over the Huskies last season. He was injured against O. S. C.

Neither team can hope to stay in the swift-paced title chase after a loss in this game. A victory for Stanford would give the Indians what amounts to a clear path to the Rose Bowl, with both Oregon and Oregon State behind them. Washington still has to meet Oregon, the "team to beat" in the far west this season.

### Oregon Teams Favored.

Two of the other teams tied for the circuit lead with a victory and a loss apiece. Oregon and Oregon State gamble little against U. C. L. A. and Washington State, respectively, in conference games. Oregon State, holding victories over both Washington and Stanford, was a heavy favorite at Pullman over the Cougars, whose only chance lay in the passing arm of sharpshooting Billy Sewell. Oregon likewise was expected to have little trouble with impotent U. C. L. A. at Los Angeles. The Bruins have been beaten soundly by Washington and Stanford.

But Southern California, another leader, was figured only a toss-up against California, the toughest defensive club in the

kicker, who has still another year with the local team. Young is one of the best, if not the best, high school kickers in the state. He also is a cool and accurate passer and is above average as a ball carrier. Part of Young's reputation as a passer, however, is due to the ability of Lee Wimberly and Tony Anderson, quarterback and end, who usually are on the receiving end. Both Wimberly and Anderson have an uncanny ability in snaring the ball from out of the air. Both are good defensive players as well. Wimberly is a very hard tackler. Two of Roseburg's strongest defensive players are Marcus Wells, full-back, and Bill Turner, guard. These two players back up the line on defense. Wells calls defensive formations and so far has shown good judgment in preparing to meet opposing strategy. Turner is the hardest tackler on the Roseburg team, and, despite the fact that he weighs only 140 pounds, is considered one of the strongest of the defense players.

**Line Defense Weak.**  
Roseburg's weakness lies in its defensive line. The players so far have not shown ability to get under the charges of opponents in running attacks thereby placing the defensive burden almost entirely upon the secondary. The line functions very well, however, on offense.

Fans who witness the game tonight may expect to see a most exciting contest, with both teams using plenty of strategy, deception and open plays as Springfield strives to stay at the top of the league and the Indians point to cutting down the margin between first and fourth place.

The Roseburg Indians will probably enter the game with their usual starting lineup with the possible exception of Bill Hohnstein at right half in place of Jack Calkins. Coach Jim Davis reported today, Calkins, the speedy Roseburg ball carrier, is suffering from a strained leg muscle but will be available for tonight's game, if needed. However, it is probable that Hohnstein, who in his first year in football has shown much promise as a backfield man, will get the starting nod. Tony Anderson, the veteran left end, will captain the team tonight. Probable starting lineups are as follows:
