## Science Courses Are Restored to Oregon University

ASHLAND, Oct. 28.—(AP)—The state board of higher education today restored to the University of Oregon the science courses which it lost under curricula revisions in 1932.

The board voted down recommendations of Chancellor Frederick M. Hunter who proposed that three undergraduate majors be developed at University of Oregon and Oregon State college, including chemistry, physics and biology (or mathematics) at the university.

Instead it recommended that beginning with the 1942-43 academic year "the University of Oregon be authorized to offer major instruction leading to undergraduate and graduate degrees in departments of mathematics, chemistry, physics, geology, botany and zoology.

The curricula committee made up of board members C. A. Brand, R. C. Groesbeck and Robert W. Ruhl moved for the restoration of the courses at the university. The proposal was unexpected and was made by the committee without a previous conference with Dr. Hunter.

On the rollcall vote Mrs. Beatrice Walton Sackett and Willard L. Marks voted "no" but after the motion had carried Mrs. Sackett moved to make the vote unanimous. Members present were Brand, Groesbeck, Ruhl, Mrs. Sackett, Marks, Dr. R. E. Kleinsorge, E. C. Sammons and Edgar W. Smith. Mac Hoke of Pendleton was not present. Weather conditions prevented his reaching Ashland by plane.
