

Bids to Execution Of Killer Issued

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 27.—(AP)—Black-bordered invitations to the execution next Thursday morning of James Harvey Thomas, 19, will be mailed by the state prison tonight to newsmen and other witnesses. Deputy Warden E. C. Halley said today.

Halley said that Thomas, convicted of slaying Douglas Smith, salesman, near Arlington, is behaving up well, although he was "pretty nervous" Saturday night. Smith, when shot by Thomas, was on his way from Idaho to Aberdeen, Wash., where his mother was on her deathbed. Smith had picked up Thomas, a hitch hiker and deserter from the navy.

Thomas will be the third person to die in the lethal gas chamber unless Governor Sprague commutes the sentence to life in prison.

Governor Sprague has no comment other than that he is studying the case. Thomas' parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Thomas of Holyoke, Utah, are in Salem and have made several appeals to the governor for clemency.

U. S. Eagles Down Many Nazi Planes

LONDON, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Pilot Carroll Warren McColpin of Buffalo, N. Y., a member of the All-American Eagle squadron in the RAF, bagged two German planes on a sweep over northern France yesterday, the air ministry announced.

He attacked six Messerschmitts. McColpin has now shot down five planes and ranks with Pilot Officer Gregory A. Daymond of Van Nuys, Calif., among the Eagles.

Pilot Officer W. R. Dunn, whose nearest relatives live at Dallas, Tex., also has shot down five in aerial combat and two while a ground gunner. McColpin, flying with two others of the squadron, became separated from them in a rain squall, but continued on a solo sweep over France while the others returned to their base.

When he saw the six Messerschmitts 500 feet above ground, he dived on them "and in a matter of seconds one had blown up and the other had dived into the ground," the air ministry said.

During the sweep seven planes, including the two destroyed by McColpin, were shot down, the ministry added. The seaplane base at Ostend was silenced, gunposts were attacked, and a factory and barges hit.

Suicide Verdict Filed In Death of Soldier

FORT LEWIS, Oct. 28.—(AP)—The army announced today an officers' board of inquiry had returned a verdict of suicide in the death of Corp. Frank Church, 24, of Prosser, found shot through the temple in a barracks' shower room Saturday.

The board's findings showed Church to have had an excellent army record. He was inducted to service a year ago and was with Company A, 161st Infantry Regiment, 41st Division.

There were no eye witnesses to the death. Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Harry Partch, of Prosser.

Suit Demands \$1,250 on Loss in Pinball Machine

SALEM, Oct. 29.—(AP)—Suit to recover \$1,250 which he claims to have lost in a pinball machine was filed in circuit court here by L. T. Groves against Charles A. Johnston, operator of Chuck's tavern, and N. J. Arnold, agent for the company which distributes the machines.

Mae West Asks Divorce From Frank Wallace

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 29.—(AP)—Mae West, burlesque stage and screen actress, filed suit yesterday to end her 1911 marriage to actor Frank Wallace—a marriage she for years denied took place.

Her suit, charging cruelty and grievous mental suffering, was filed as a cross-complaint to Wallace's separate maintenance action. The divorce suit specified no instances of the cruelty it alleged.

Wallace, now a resident of Ontario, Calif., instituted his action in San Bernardino county. Superior Judge Allison denied his plea for \$1,000 monthly maintenance pending trial, commenting:

"There is nothing in this case that would convince me the plaintiff is not motivated by profit in filing this action."
