FROM Kulbyshev (new Russian seat of government) an AP correspondent tells today of a "leapfrog" movement of manufacturing equipment and personnel from western Russia to the German invasion in June.

MONTHS ago an American engineer told of Chinese airplane factories whose machines were mounted on trucks and literally stopped beside the road and manufactured planes for use against the Japanese.

This Chinese idea, along with the "scorched earth" policy, seems to have been adopted by the Russians.

STALIN apparently grasped from the first the important fact that saving Russia's armies from destruction and keeping them intact and unbroken in morale, so as to remain as a continuing threat to the Germans, was his biggest job.
