Minimum Parity
Of 110 Pct. Urged

HOOD RIVER, Nov. 17. — (AP) — Farm product prices should not be pegged at less than 110 percent of parity price, the Oregon Farm Bureau federation said Saturday.

A resolution advocated that parity prices, adjusted periodically, be extended to all farm products to maintain agricultural profits at a level with those of industry and labor.

The federation also recommended wage and tax regulations to prevent inflation. The group, however, opposed the Langer bill which would authorize control of farm wages.

Other resolutions favored:

An open season on both sexes of deer, elk and antelope; continuation of pear psylla and wild garlic weed control; continuation of the AAA soil conservation program and Oregon State college efforts in controlling hairy vetch and pear weevil.

The federation opposed consolidation of the forest service and grazing division of the department of agriculture.

Mac Hoke, Pendleton, was re-elected president. Lowell Steen, Milton, and R. A. Collins, Hood River, were named vice-presidents.

National Forest Timber for Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon up to and including November 27, 1941 for all the timber marked or designated for cutting located on an area embracing about 38 acres within Lot 4, Section 22, T. 32 S., R. 3 W., W. M., Applegate Watershed, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, amounting to 326,000 feet B.M. of Douglas fir, 60,000 feet B.M. of sugar pine, 14,000 feet B.M. of California incense cedar, and 40,000 feet B.M. of white fir. Also, on an area embracing about 40 acres within the SE 1/4 Sec. 22, T. 32 S., R. 3 W., W. M., Applegate Watershed, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, amounting to 200,000 feet B.M. of Douglas fir and 40,000 feet B.M. of sugar pine. Bid must include timber within Lot 4 indicated above, but may exclude the other area at option of bidder. No bid of less than \$2.00 per M. feet for Douglas fir, \$7.00 per M. feet for sugar pine, \$5.00 per M. feet for white fir, \$5.00 per M. feet for California incense cedar will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for the stumpage a cooperative deposit of \$20 per M. feet B.M. to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal will be required. \$1,000 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon.
