Better family living through the use of more nourishing foods is a vital part of the national defense program. Examinations of many of our young men for entry in the national defense forces show that a better diet is greatly needed in many American homes. Investigations also show that it is not a lack of available nourishing foods that has caused undernourishment of many people, but rather the lack of knowledge as to the foods which have the

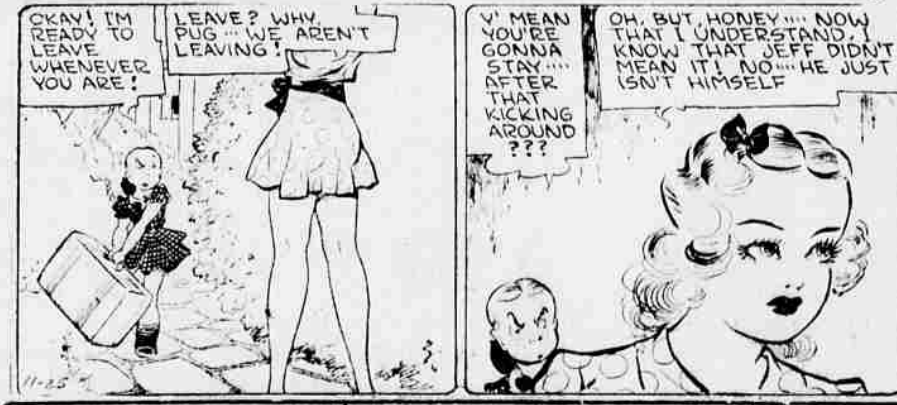
