Sprague Defers Naming Of New Adj. General

SALEM, Nov. 25.—(AP)—Governor Sprague indicated today he would be in no hurry to appoint an adjutant general to succeed Major General George A. White, who died in Portland Sunday. "Lieutenant Colonel Elmer V. Wootton is acting adjutant general and he will remain so," the governor said, without telling how long it would be before he appoints a regular adjutant general. Wootton, however, could remain in his present capacity until the Oregon National Guard is released from federal service. "There is no need now for a full-time adjutant general, since we have no troops now," he added.

Agreement Ends Threat Of Telephone Strike

NEW YORK, Nov. 25.—(AP)—Threat of a telephone strike affecting long distance communications in 42 states had been eased today by an agreement between the American Telephone and Telegraph company and the Federation of Long Lines Telephone workers, an independent union representing 15,000 workers. The agreement provided for wage increases totaling \$3,000,000 annually and creation of two boards to make further wage adjustments and study geographic wage differentials.

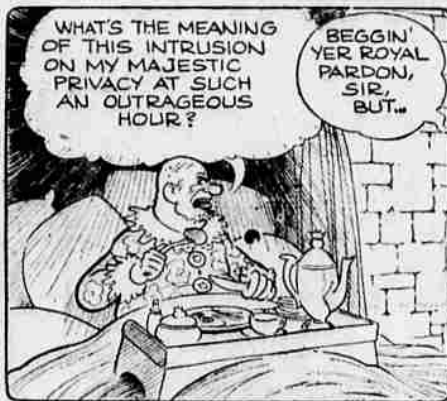
He had turned over powers of the presidency temporarily to Geronimo Mendez, leader of the radical party, on November 10 because of failing health. He was 62.
