## Sell-Out Sign Up For U. of O.-O. S. C. Football Battle

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 28.—(AP)—The sell-out sign was posted today at the University of Oregon stadium where the Ducks meet Oregon State college in their traditional civil war football game Saturday.

Anse Cornell, athletic manager, said there would be no general admission sale since every seat in the 20,000-plus capacity stadium was already gone.

Coach Tex Oliver has made no announcement of his starting line-up. Last-minute decisions were expected on the basis of crippled linemen's response to treatment.

It is likely however that the regular backfield of Duke Iverson, quarterback; Tommy Roblin and Curt Meacham, halfbacks, and Bob Koch, fullback, will start.

CORVALLIS, Ore., Nov. 28.—(AP)—Campus fever began to soar today in anticipation of Saturday's football game at Eugene between the possible Rose Bowlers, Oregon State, and their final hurdle, the University of Oregon. "Beat Oregon" signs appeared on cars, windows and as cut-out lines in the Daily Barometer, student newspaper, but Rose Bowl talk was hushed.

The traditional rivalry between the two schools was all the students needed to work up enthusiasm, and talk of bowl possibilities was with a crossed-finger tone and a weather eye out for Coach Lon Stiner, who has frowned on its mention in his presence.

The Beavers will enter the game at full strength, all regulars and first-string reserves being ready for the fray.

## Western Steel Capital Will Be Provo, Utah

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27.—(AP)—Pig iron and steel plant expansions at Provo, Utah, which will cost approximately \$125,000,000 and be financed with federal funds are expected by the office of production management to make that city the steel capital of the western states.

O. P. M. officials said today that an additional \$91,000,000 development at Provo announced last night by Jesse Jones, federal loan administrator, gave to Provo open-hearth steel-making facilities and blooming and plate mills previously scheduled by the OPM for Pittsburg, Calif., near San Francisco.

They said the OPM steel section recommended the transfers to Provo because that city's nearness to coal mines and iron ore appeared to make it the strategic spot for development of integrated steel operations to furnish plates for the west coast's enormously expanding ship building industry.

The business blow, a left hook flush to Giambastiani's jaw, came after one minute and 24 seconds of the third round.

The excitement developed after two rounds of colorless boxing in which Louis shuffled slowly around the ring toying with his sparring partner.

Suddenly in the third round, Giambastiani decided to exchange a few blows with the champion. He did and Joe retaliated with a Sunday punch.

"In the excitement I slipped one too many in. I'm awfully sorry," the champion apologized later.
