

Woman Held For Bank Holdup Try

VANCOUVER, B. C., Nov. 28.—(CP)—Marie Dueck, 26, was held in city jail today on a charge of attempted robbery with violence following her arrest in a cafe yesterday after an attempt had been made to hold up an east end branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce.

Dennis Boyd, teller, said that shortly before 3 p. m. closing time "a platinum blond with blue eyes" approached his wicket and pushed the barrel of a gun through the bars of his cage with the command: "stick 'em up."

Boyd said he ducked behind the counter and shouted to an employee, Miss C. Yipp, to telephone police. The woman bandit took alarm and fled, pursued by Boyd, who followed her to a nearby cafe. He remained outside until police arrived. Police subsequently said the woman's weapon was a toy pistol but Boyd said "it looked realistic enough at the time."

The teller said that after the woman's approach "the first thing I knew I was on the floor with my own gun in my hand. But I couldn't shoot her—she was a woman."

Drug Sale Restriction Draws Injunction Suit

PORTLAND, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Hudson-Duncan and company filed suit in circuit court yesterday to enjoin the Oregon board of pharmacy from enforcing an order restricting sales of proprietary medicines and household remedies to drug stores.

The order, effective January 2, has no relation to the public health and affords the public no protection, the complaint says, asserting it would give druggists sole sale of tooth pastes, nose drops, headache cures, cough syrups, cleaning fluid, rubbing

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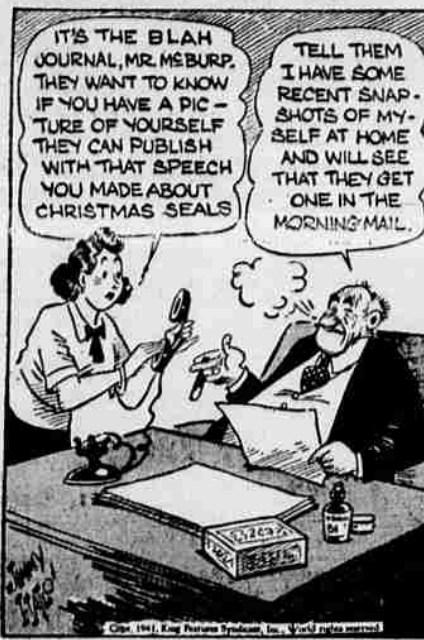

TOKYO, Japan, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Thirteen persons were killed, many wounded and more than 250 houses were demolished in a terrific cyclone, Domet reported today.

More than 3,500 houses in Tokyo were reported under water due to the gale.

U. S.-Japanese Parley Nearing Collapse

persons watched the S. S. President Harrison depart with the last contingent of Shanghai's U. S. marine garrison, ending a 14-year sojourn in the Orient. The remaining detachments at Peking and Tientsin, less than 200 in number, were expected to leave soon from a north China port, completely removing all American marines from Japanese-occupied China as ordered by President Roosevelt amid the heightening tension.

Thailand First to Be Hit

Informed quarters in Washington said they expected an invasion of Thailand, adjoining both British Burma and Malaya, would be Tokyo's first move if the Japanese government decided to reject Secretary of State Hull's basic formula for peace in the Pacific.

There were strong indications that Japan had virtually abandoned any hope of a settlement through the "last chance" mission of Special Envoy Kurihara to Washington, with Domet, the Japanese news agency, declaring that "there is little room for prolongation" of the negotiations.

The Tokyo government gave no immediate clue to its next step, but the newspaper Nichi Nichi charged that Britain had massed more than 50,000 troops on Thailand's frontiers, and behind the scenes it was evident that Japan was at least preparing to resume her program of armed expansion southward. A Vichy broadcast said six more shiploads of Japanese troops arrived today at two Indo-China ports, where they would be in a position for a quick thrust into Thailand.

Thailand Claims Assurance

Reuters, the British news agency, quoted Thailand's Premier Songgram as telling his people that he had British and American assurances of respect of Thailand's independence. A BBC broadcast said the premier announced British-American "guarantees" against aggression, but authoritative London quarters said they had no information to substantiate any such far-reaching assurances.

Dispatches from Bangkok said Songgram had urged the people to remain calm, declaring the Japanese envoy had told him that Japanese forces in Indo-China were not meant for aggression against Thailand. Nevertheless, the Thai national assembly quickly approved measures empowering the government to prepare for war and act to meet any emergency.

Meanwhile, Air Chief Marshal Brooke-Popham, commander-in-chief of British Far East forces, greeted several thousand new troops to his steadily growing command.

A communique said the new arrivals from the United Kingdom were "the usual weekly reinforcements," which by now must number high in the tens of thousands.

wrested from Emperor Haile Selassie in the invasion of 1935-36, was thus wiped out and British troops in that sector freed for action in north Africa.

The announcement gave no details on the number of prisoners taken by the attacking empire force of Highland troops, Indians, Sudanese and south and west African units.

Military observers said, however, the Gondar garrison was believed to exceed 10,000 men—at least half of them Italians.

A BBC broadcast said the British Mediterranean fleet sweeping the waters between Libya and Crete, had so effectively blocked the axis that since the beginning of the "great tank battles in Libya" not one ton of supplies has reached the hard-pressed German and Italian armies by sea.

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It rejected by a standing vote of 102 to 53 an amendment by Representative Robertson which would forbid any agency or official of the government approving or recommending wage increases which the price control administrator deemed inflationary. Soviet reports said Adolf Hitler's invasion armies before Moscow were suffering "tremendous" losses, with as many as 15,500 Germans killed in a single day.

Front-line reports to Pravda, communist party newspaper, said the Germans were striking savagely on both flanks of Moscow's defense arc, with the heaviest blows apparently falling on the southern wing.

A bulletin from Hitler's field headquarters was brief, declaring merely that the German armies had pierced strong Soviet defenses before the capital.

In the Ukraine, the Nazi high command took note of bitter Russian counter-attacks near Rostov-on-Don and elsewhere in the Donets river basin but asserted they had been repulsed with heavy losses.
