Series E Bonds are for ownership only by individuals in their own right and are issued in amounts from \$18.75 to \$750 (cost price). Series F and G Bonds are designed for investment by corporations, trustees, associations, partnerships, etc., as well as individuals, and range from \$74 to \$10,000 (cost price).
