Turkey Show Is Scheduled For Next Year

Annual Display Will Be Continued Unless War Forces Cancellation

Unless war conditions prevent, the Northwest Turkey Show, which last week was staged at Oakland, Oregon, for the 13th consecutive year, will be held in 1942, it was announced by officers of the Northwest Turkey Breeders association. The association has sponsored the show each year, the plan having been developed to improve quality and increase interest in the breeding of turkeys. As a result of the show, the Oregon broad-breasted turkeys have dominated the turkey markets throughout the United States, commanding higher prices, while at the same time a wide field has been opened for the furnishing of eggs to commercial hatcheries at a decided premium.

Officers of the association felt that many benefits achieved by the show would be lost, should it be dropped for a year, consequently the decision to continue next year if possible, even if a curtailment in magnitude is necessary.
