Railroads Plead for Ten Pct. Increase in Rates

ST. LOUIS, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Three members of the interstate commerce commission yesterday began hearing a plea of the nation's railroads for a 10 per cent increase in freight and passenger rates.

The roads said they were needed because of higher wages being paid under a recent arbitration award and because of other increased operating costs which they attributed to the war.

It has been estimated the higher wages will add more than \$300,000,000 annually to the roads' payrolls.

In an opening statement R. V. Fletcher of Washington, vice president of the Association of American Railroads, said the need for handling war traffic without delay made a hearing on a flat percentage increase necessary rather than a hearing on higher rates for specific commodities. A commodity hearing would take too long, he explained.

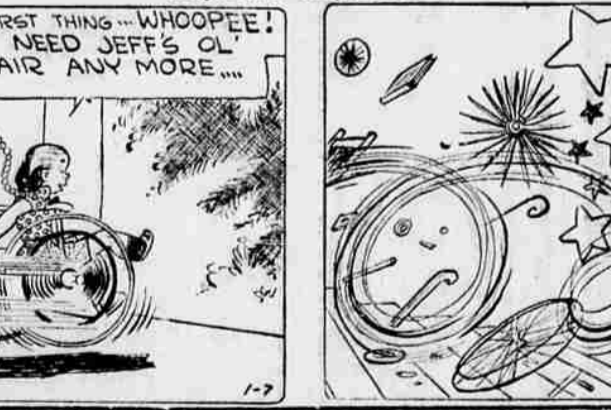
