With Major Hoopie Around the County

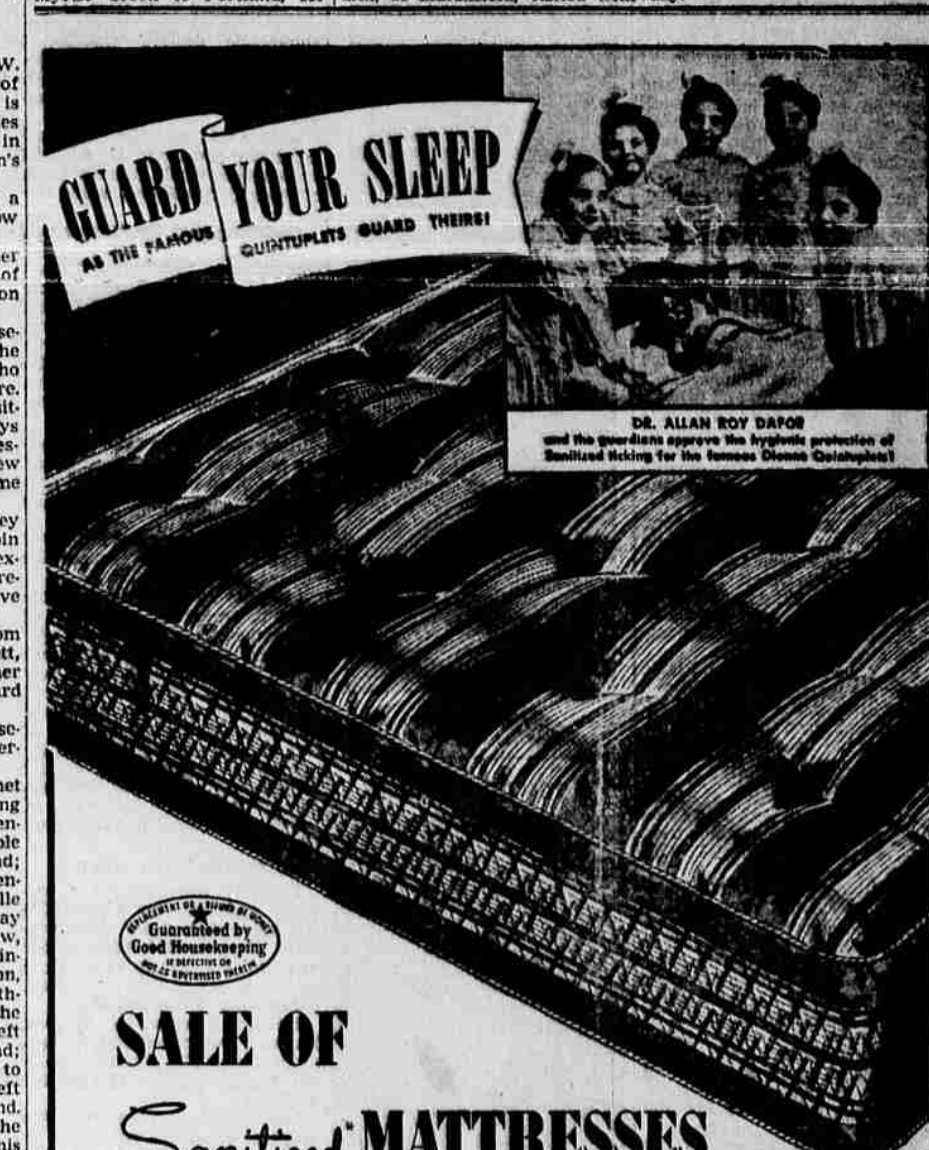
