Officer Deprived of Command Gets New Post

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—Major General Frederick Martin, who was relieved of command of the Hawaiian air force after the Pearl Harbor attack, was given a new assignment today in a general shakeup of the army air forces.

Martin was made commander of the second air force with headquarters at Fort George Wright, Wash., which has responsibility for aerial defense of the vital northwest sector of the continental United States.
