Eliot Successor to Zuppke at Illinois

CHAMPAIGN, Ill., Jan. 30.—(AP) In vast memorial stadium built during the pre-Grange era of Bob Zuppke-coached, Illinois football teams, a Zuppke pupil named Ray Eliot will direct the University of Illinois gridgers next fall.

Just six years old when Zuppke began his 29-season reign here in 1913, Eliot held the position of line coach when his appointment was announced yesterday.

In some corners both Illinois and non-Illinois inquired: "Who's Eliot?"

Part of the explanation for his relative obscurity is the fact he went through school as Ray Nusspickel, adopting the name Eliot only a few years ago.

Many Illinois graduates recalled the Ray Nusspickel who, despite the handicap of glasses, played on the football teams of 1930 and 1931 and was a catcher on the baseball team.

PORTLAND, Jan. 30.—(AP) Tire requirements of Oregon logging truck operators should be reported now, O. L. Price, state rationing administrator, said today.

He said that early reporting would aid in setting up quotas. Allotments are based to some extent, he said, on the previous month's requirements.

Price said that the problem of supplying tires for the logging truck industry in the northwest was being given serious consideration in Washington and that there was hope of relieving the situation created by rationing.

Red Cross Canteen Corps is Forming

The Douglas county chapter of the American Red Cross, in cooperation with the county civilian defense council, is organizing a volunteer canteen corps for Roseburg. Mrs. Roy Bellows, chapter canteen corps chairman, announced today.

The primary purpose of a Red Cross canteen corps is to provide an organization that is trained and equipped to meet the problems of emergency feeding in time of disaster. Such a group may be called upon in emergencies occasioned by epidemics, fires, floods, and in those arising from sabotage and war. It may be needed in the feeding of families affected by such disasters or in the serving of food to fire fighters, air raid wardens, or others engaged in the protection of life and property during a disaster. Its training enables it to function promptly and efficiently.

The necessary training required is a Red Cross standard course in nutrition and Red Cross canteen course taught by instructors holding a B. S. or B. A. degree in home economics with major in food and nutrition.
