

B Leaguers to be Seen in Roseburg in Two Tournaments

Douglas Basketeers to Open Series Feb. 12; Four-County Bill Slated Feb. 27 and 28

Basketball fans of Roseburg and vicinity will have an opportunity to see plenty of action. In addition to the games scheduled by the local high schools, two tournaments are to be played here.

The annual Douglas county B league tournament will be played next week, February 12, 13 and 14, and the district tournament between three teams from Douglas county, two from Coos county, two from Curry county and one from Deschutes county will be played February 27 and 28.

The county B league tournament is being played earlier than usual because of the complaints from past seasons that Douglas county teams have been handicapped by too strenuous schedules. Heretofore the teams have played in the county tournament and have then gone directly into the district playoffs and, if successful, have gone immediately into the state championship contests.

The arrangement this year will give a week of rest between the B league tournament and the district tournament.

Consolation included. Another change in arrangements this year will provide a free-for-all consolation tournament. This will replace the volleyball playoffs of previous years, as volleyball has not been played on a county-wide league scale this season. Any basketball teams not playing in the championship series at the senior high school, will be permitted to enter the consolation tournament to be held at the junior high.

The county B league tournament will start at 4 p. m. Thursday with Camas Valley and Gardiner meeting in the first bracket. Myrtle Creek and Yoncalla, in the second bracket, will meet at 5 p. m. Drain and Lookingglass, third bracket, will play at 7:30 p. m. and Reedsport and Glendale, fourth bracket, will play at 8:45 p. m.

First and second bracket losers will play at 4 p. m. Friday in the first consolation flight, while the winners will enter the semifinals at 7:30 p. m. Friday. Third and fourth bracket losers will play at 5:30 p. m. Friday and the winners at 8:45 p. m. Consolation and championship finals will be played Saturday night.

The three top teams from the Douglas county B league will enter the district B-5 tournament February 27 and 28.

Slated for Finals. In the first bracket of the district tournament the third place Douglas team will meet the Coos county second place team. The Douglas county champions will meet the Curry county second place team in the second bracket while the Douglas second place team will meet the Curry champions in the third bracket. Coos and Deschutes county champions will be paired in the fourth bracket. The four games will be played Friday, February 27, starting

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at 4 p. m., and continuing through the afternoon and evening.

Semifinals will be played Saturday morning at 9:30 a. m. and 10:45 a. m., with the finals at 8:45 p. m.

The games of both tournaments are expected to furnish plenty of excitement and sponsors are hoping for a large attendance.

RHS Hoopsters Ready to Battle Medford Tonight

The Roseburg High basketball team plays a "do-or-die" game with Medford at the local gym tonight at 7:30. The winner of this game will rest atop the league for at least a week while the loser may drop to third place. In the only previous contest between these two schools Roseburg won easily, 29-27, as only a last quarter Medford rally made the game close. Medford has shown decided improvement since then however, and a fast-breaking, hard-shooting club like Medford can get "hot" any time. Medford has been led by three big players, Herman, Fawcett, and Reynolds, who usually control backboards and also do most of the scoring.

The Medford traveling squad is one of the largest in the league numbering from 12 to 14 players, while most teams have a maximum of 10. Medford boasts ten men who are nearly equal in ability and they are thus able to substitute frequently without impairing team work.

The Indians went through a short but brisk workout last night in preparation for the big game. Coach Davis reports that the team is in the best possible mental and physical condition and should put up stiff resistance in this important contest. The Indians have continued practicing foul shooting as this department has won several games so far this season. There will be no preliminary tonight, due to the B League teams preparing for next week's county tournament.

U. S.-To-Alaska Highway Project Aired at Hearing

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—

Thomas Riggs, acting chairman of the Alaska international highway commission, told the house roads committee today he would like to see the proposed U. S.-Alaska road to a stretch from Prince George, B. C., north to Fairbanks, Alaska.

Riggs, former governor of the territory, was supporting a bill to authorize construction of a highway from the United States, across Canada to Alaska. He said he preferred what is known as Route A from Seattle to Prince George to Whitehouse, Y. T., to Fairbanks. Replying to questions of Representative Anderson (R. Minn.) Riggs said there already were highways from Seattle to Prince George and good highway and railroad connections from the midwest to Prince George.

Riggs said that the bill left the selection of the route to President Roosevelt and that undoubtedly he would choose it after consultation with military and naval experts.

Riggs said further that he would prefer constructing a railroad from Alaska from the United States but that the great expense and length of time required would "make it out of the question during the present war." He said negotiations with Canada for the route would begin as soon as congress approved the project and that Canada would be found agreeable to the construction.

John T. Logan, an airline operations employee from New York, who made a motorcycle trip over the proposed route in 1939, said a road easily could be constructed.

Donald McDonald of Fairbanks, Alaska, member of the

highway commission and known as "father of the Alaska highway," testified that bombers based in Alaska could reach all of the capitals of Europe, Asia and North America with ease. He said the territory was "absolutely dependent upon the United States" and that shipping through the inside passage to Alaska was always a dangerous trip.

Railroads' Profit Shows Huge Gain

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—

The nation's class 1 railroads had an estimated net income of \$500,545,671 in 1941 which was more than two and a half times the 1940 profit, the Association of American Railroads reported today.

This was the first time since 1930 that their income exceeded the half billion mark. In that year, the net was \$523,907,472. Operating revenues last year totaled \$5,346,699,998, an increase of \$1,048,700,000 over 1940 and an increase of \$66,000,000 compared with 1930.

Net railway operating income before payment of interest and rentals for the nation's 135 class 1 railroads last year amounted to \$999,502,930, a return of 3.79 per cent on property investment compared with a return of 2.61 per cent in 1940 and 3.36 in 1930.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 5.—(AP)—Southern Pacific company will receive the first deliveries this month of a \$28,000,000 order for locomotives and freight cars. Almost a year ago the company ordered 40 freight locomotives, 10 streamlined steam passenger locomotives, 23 diesel-electric locomotives, and 4,885 freight cars.

President A. T. Mercher said he expected delivery would be completed by August.

War Insurance Bill is Approved

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—

Legislation to provide for premium insurance on war property losses beginning next summer but authorizing unlimited free insurance in the meantime was approved by the house banking committee.

Chairman Steagall (D., Ala.) said the committee had re-written a senate-approved bill which would authorize free insurance against such losses up to \$15,000.

"We decided that property owners would be eligible to receive free insurance for war damage up to a reasonable limit the reconstruction finance corporation may determine, but only until a permanent program, with premiums, can be worked out," Steagall said.

He added that the permanent plan would have to be put in operation not later than July 1.

The legislation would authorize the RFC to allot up to \$1,000,000,000 to the war damage corporation to finance the program and also would increase the RFC borrowing power by \$2,500,000,000. Officials told committees the limit thus would be raised to about \$10,000,000,000.
