

Medford Defeats Hillsboro in An Overtime Battle

SALEM, Mar. 13.—(AP)—Astoria's defending champions had that championship sparkle last night as they thumped McMinnville, 45-25, and took a favored place in the state high school basketball tournament semifinals.

Baker's Bulldogs, who defeated North Bend, 39-32, meet the fishermen tonight in what may be the decisive game of the tournament.

In the upper bracket, Corvallis had an easy time with Mount Angel, 47-25, and tonight will meet Medford. Medford went overtime to down Hillsboro yesterday, 29-23.

Medford came from behind to eliminate Hillsboro. The count was tied 5-11 at the quarter and Hillsboro held a 12-10 lead at the half.

At three quarters Medford still trailed, 17-15, but in a whirlwind rally, the black tornado moved ahead 23-21 with 20 seconds to go. Hillsboro tied it up with a last-second basket, but was helpless in the overtime period.

Neidermeyer, Nonteth and Webber each dropped one through the hoop for the Medford victory.

Citizens Save German Mortar From Scrap Pile ST. HELENS, Mar. 13.—(AP)—St. Helens residents, aroused by the city council's announced intention of selling a World-war German mortar for scrap, subsidized today.

Medal Given Youth for Warning at Pearl Harbor WASHINGTON, Mar. 13.—(AP)—The distinguished service medal was received yesterday by Staff Sergeant Joseph L. Lockard, who delivered the unheeded warning of the approach of planes to Pearl harbor shortly before the Japanese attack December 7.

Undersecretary of War Patterson presented the medal to Lockard for "exceptionally meritorious service to your country" with the declaration, "may the warning of danger to your country never go unheeded again."

Lockard, who today entered the officer's training school at Fort Monmouth, N. J., accepted the medal with a modest, "thank you, Judge Patterson."

Financial Aid Assured Kin of U. S. Soldiers WASHINGTON, Mar. 13.—(AP)—Acting under authority of a newly enacted law, army and navy officials sought today to remove any possibility of financial distress among families of American soldiers, sailors and marines captured by the enemy or reported missing.

The law, empowering the secretaries of war and navy to order dependency allotments from salaries of men captured or missing, was signed by President Roosevelt earlier this week, and officials said many cases of real or potential hardship were expected to be quickly corrected.
