

Douglas County's Registrants in War Draft Lottery of March 16th Are Listed

Following are the order and serial numbers of men registered with the Douglas county selective service board on Feb. 16, 1942. The order numbers were determined by a lottery held March 17 and appear in the first column below. The number 10,000 was arbitrarily added to all order numbers of the third draft in order to simplify handling. Thus No. 10234 would indicate that the registrant holding such number is number 234 in order of call in this registration. The same rule applied to higher numbers, such as 11234 would indicate the registrant to be 1234 in order number. The serial number, appearing in the second column below, running from 1 through 1550, was affixed by the local board for identification. Both the serial number and order number in each case is officially preceded by the letter "T" as the designation for the third draft. The letter is omitted from the list published herewith. Publication of order and serial numbers of registrants will continue until the entire list is made available for News-Review readers.

Bettina Wins Hot Bout With Dorazio

PHILADELPHIA, April 1.—(AP)—Mello Bettina, former light heavyweight champion, has started a campaign he hopes will earn him a crack at Joe Louis' heavyweight crown some time this summer.

The Bercon, N. Y., southpaw, who fights Booker Beckwith in Chicago on April 10, took a big stride in the right direction here last night by gaining a unanimous 10-round decision over Philadelphia's Gus Dorazio in a savage give-and-take scrap.

Bettina's whirlwind finish in the final round, during which he cuffed Dorazio groggy, won him the decision. Until the 10th Dorazio, a 3-to-1 underdog, virtually was on even terms and had a splendid opportunity to score a major upset. In the sixth Dorazio, who at 190 held a five-pound weight advantage, had Bettina on the verge of a knockout. But Bettina saved himself by staggering into a clinch.

It was Bettina's 10th straight victory as a heavyweight since he lost his lightweight crown. If he beats Beckwith, Promoter Heeman Taylor said he plans to match him with either Max Baer or Lou Nova in an outdoors bout here in May.

Red Cross Goal for War Duty Far Exceeded

WASHINGTON, April 1.—(AP)—President Roosevelt disclosed yesterday that the \$65,000,000 war fund sought by the American Red Cross had been oversubscribed and contributions still were coming in.

Raid Damage Insurance to Private Property Offered

WASHINGTON, April 1.—(AP)—President Roosevelt has signed a bill authorizing a \$1,000,000,000 fund for the war damage corporation to provide federal insurance against damage to private property resulting from enemy air raids.

Marriage Barrier on Naval Officers Lifted

WASHINGTON, April 1.—(AP)—The navy abandoned today its rule that officers of the navy and marine corps may not marry

during the first two years after they receive their commission. Word of the change was dispatched to all ships and shore stations and ended the ten-year-old prohibition for the duration of the war.

Groups affected by the order were chiefly graduates of the U. S. naval academy and junior reserve aviation officers. Midshipmen at Annapolis and reserve aviation cadets had been required to sign agreements not to marry for two years after being commissioned—the penalty for breaking the agreement being loss of the commission.

Legion Urged to Press for All-Out War Duty Draft

SALEM, April 1.—Neil R. Allen, Grants Pass, vice chairman of the American Legion national committee on civilian defense and former commander of the Oregon department of the legion, demanded today that Oregon legionnaires take the lead in carrying out the mandate of the 1941 national Legion convention that property, capital, labor and industry be drafted for war service.

Allen, in an article published in the Oregon Legionaire, official publication of the state department of the Legion, said the Legion "can die during this war—it may be dying right now—unless it develops immediately a dynamic leadership in every post and department, and in the nation, devoted to its own declared basic principle of universal service in war."
