from a raid against England, the British said. The air ministry announced other British aircraft attacked airmen and a railway junction in the same area.

A German aircraft caused slight bomb damage in southwest England on a solo attack last night, a London communique reported.

The Vichy radio, head in Lon-

don, said today that two of 10 Norwegian ships which made a dash for England from Goteborg, Sweden, Thursday had reached an English port.

Two others returned to Goteborg and two were sunk, the Vichy radio said, adding that there was no news from the other four.

First reports of the mass escape attempt said 11 had tried to break through the German blockade for England.

The Vichy radio also said nazi dive-bombers set a 2,000-ton vessel afire yesterday in a radio on Kola bay, on which the Russian Arctic port of Murmansk is situated.

Axis aerial attacks have hit the Alexandria-Mersa Matruh railway effectively at several points and a medium-sized tanker bound for Malta has been torpedoed and sunk by an Italian submarine, the high command at Rome said today.

Several dozen vehicles were reported set afire or heavily damaged by air force action against a British motorized column.

"On the Cirenaica (eastern Libya) front enemy reconnaissance patrols clashed with our armored units, which repulsed the enemy attacks with losses on armored vehicles and men," the high command said.

Air fights with German and Italian formations were said to have cost the British 17 planes.

survivors, and only about one-third of the crews of the two ships were saved, the navy announced last night.

The old fashioned, flush deck destroyer Peary was bombed and sunk about Feb. 19 at Darwin, Australia going down with her guns firing. The loss of life was believed light.

Japs Bomb Mandalay Japanese fliers bombed storied Mandalay, which was first attacked Feb. 19, and two other towns in central Burma behind the British-Chinese lines, the British announced. A communique said a hospital was set afire, but declared there was no military damage at Mandalay and that aerial toll elsewhere was inconsequential.

Withdrawal of British covering forces on the Irrawaddy valley front to main defense positions north of Promye was said to have proceeded satisfactorily yesterday despite heavy plane and infantry attacks.

Burma is regarded as the "real danger spot" now by Lieut. Gov. Van Mook of the Netherlands East Indies.

Speaking in Melbourne, the refugee executive expressed belief the Japanese would seek simply to neutralize Australia's increasingly powerful bases, rather than attempt a full invasion.

Naval observers at Washington pointed out that when the battle of Java was fought U. S. vessels were handicapped by lack of air support. Now, however, the growing strength of American land-based units in northern Australia may reverse the picture.

From official and eye-witness accounts of the new sinkings came tales of individual heroism which matched anything in naval history.

When one gun crew was knocked out by the blast of a bomb, another took over immediately. An officer stayed on a sinking ship to fight off a Japanese bomber's strafing attack on helpless men in the water. An enlisted man "gunnery control walker" refused to leave the bridge when he was wounded, and later risked his life in an attempt to save the ship's pay records.

The Langley, converted from a collier to become America's first aircraft carrier and later turned into a tender to serve both seaplanes and airplanes, had been claimed sunk by the Japanese at least three times during the first month of the war. During this time the historic vessel, known to bluejackets as the "old covered wagon," had gone undamaged.

Commander Robert P. McConnell, who commanded the Langley, and Lieutenant Commander Elmer P. Abernathy of the Pecos gave details of the Java battles at San Francisco last night. Lieutenant Commander John M. Birmingham of the Peary was killed in action.

Muslims, Too, Dissatisfied. Declaring that Britain's plan for post-war Indian dominion status would "keep Muslims tied to the chariot wheels of Hinduism," Mohammed Ali Jinnah indicated at New Delhi today that the autonomy proposal already rejected by the powerful all-India congress party also was unsatisfactory to his Muslim league.

Jinnah, leader of India's second largest party, expressed deep disappointment that the "entirely and integrity of the Muslim nation was not expressly recognized" in the offer outlined by Sir Stafford Cripps in an effort to bring the Indians wholeheartedly into the war effort.

Mandalay, storied city in eastern Burma toward which the Japanese have pointed an invasion army, was heavily bombed yesterday by the Japanese air force but no military damage was done, the British reported from London today.

A communique said a hospital caught fire and the patients had to be moved to safety during the bombing. It also reported two other towns in central Burma were bombed yesterday but said damage was slight.

Japanese bombs have fallen on Mandalay before. On February 19, the Japanese reported, they scored direct hits on military installations and inflicted heavy damage.
