Hospital Tag Day Set for May 16

The date of Saturday, May 16, has been set for the Shrine hospital tag day to be sponsored jointly by the various fraternal orders of Roseburg. Ralph L. Russell, chairman of the local Fraternal week committee, reported today. A committee has been named in each county of the state, representing all lodges, to work out benefits for the shrine hospital as an exemplification of fraternalism.

An effort will be made, Russell stated, to have the tag day observed in every town throughout the county, and in addition receptacles will be placed in business places throughout the county where small contributions can be left. These receptacles will be making their appearance within the next few days, he said.

"While the Shrine hospital is sponsored by one lodge, all fraternal orders recognize the worthwhile work it is doing," Russell said. "It was unanimously agreed that no better exemplification could be given of fraternalism than to aid this institution. Incidentally it is interesting to know that at the present time 27 children from Douglas county are patients there."
