LIBERTY CAKE

1/2 cup fat 1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup sugar 2 eggs, beaten
1/2 cup orange juice 1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon lemon extract 1/2 cup raisins
1 teaspoon grated orange rind 1/2 cup coconut
1/2 cup nuts
Cream fat and sugar. Add eggs, juice, extracts and rind. Beat 2 minutes. Add flour, soda and raisins. Beat 2 minutes. Pour into shallow pan lined with waxed paper. Sprinkle butter with coconut and nuts. Bake 30 minutes in moderate oven (350).
