Plans were made for a meeting Thursday, July 30, at 8 o'clock at the Roseburg Women's clubhouse, at which time, Miss Ethel Mealey, consultant in health education with the state board of health, will speak. Miss Mealey is a member of the University of Oregon Medical school faculty and speaks very interestingly.

Authorization was given for the purchase of an adequate supply of cod liver oil capsules for use through the county health office; also for special sick-room necessities to be loaned wherever they are needed. Included are sheets, pillowcases, ice-bag, ice-cap, hot-water bottles, etc.

The education committee was instructed to secure information regarding the newest films available on tuberculosis, with the expectation of immediate purchase. Films secured in this way are to be shown before any groups desiring them for general education and entertainment, particularly to impress the need for early diagnosis in control of the disease. Their use will also increase interest in Christmas seal sales, from which funds are secured to pay for skin-tests and chest X-rays for persons unable to provide the service for themselves. The average number of X-rays per month during this fiscal year has been about 25. Since the charge for this service has been doubled in recent weeks, the seal sales chairman is planning a more intensive campaign for this winter to secure more funds.

Meetings of the Health association are held on the last Thursday evening of every month. All persons interested in public health are urged to attend and give support to the activity.

### Voluntary Allocation Of Meat Asked of Trade

## Resident Sports Fee Favored For Soldiers, Oregon

SALEM, July 25—(AP)—A bill should be presented to the next Oregon legislature permitting soldiers stationed in the state to obtain hunting and fishing licenses at no more than the cost to residents. Governor Charles A. Sprague said in a letter today to C. L. Jamison, Canyon City, secretary of the Gattle and Horse Raisers association.

The governor said he was recommending that the state game commission prepare such a bill. "I am very sorry that it is not possible under the law to allow soldiers stationed for duty within the state to hunt and fish by the purchase of resident hunting and fishing licenses," the governor wrote to Jamison. "It is necessary, as the law is now written, for them to obtain non-resident hunting and fishing licenses unless their permanent home has been in Oregon."

Resident licenses cost \$3 each or \$5 for combination hunting and fishing permits. Non-residents must pay \$5 for fishing and \$15 for hunting licenses.

### Fire Destroys Electric Motor at Carl's Tavern

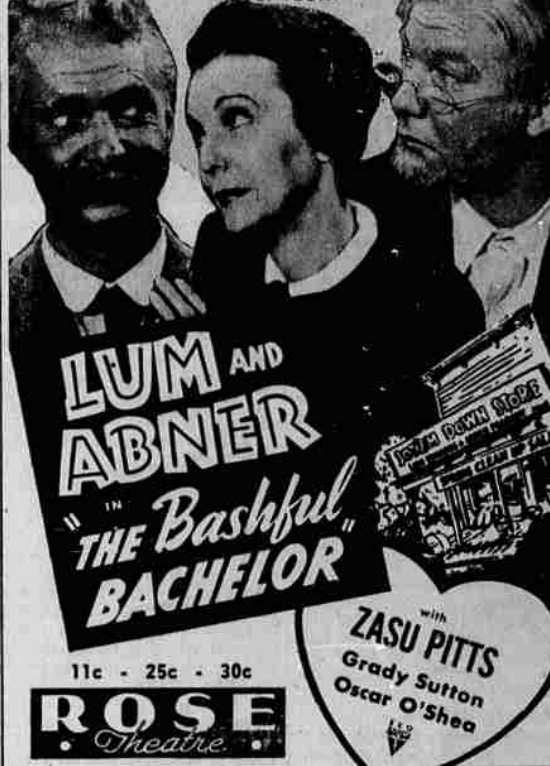
