SAN FRANCISCO, July 30.— (AP)—The Red Cross said today it cannot accept individual par-cels from relatives, friends and organizations for war prisoners in the western Pacific and will carry only its own food packages c∩ the relief ship it hopes soon to send into the war zone. A. L. Shafer, Pacific area man-

ager, and Charles E. Balley, American Red Cross shipping ad-American Red Cross shipping ad-ministrator, explained that the beltigerents would not allow dis-tribution of any supplies other than those prepared and shipped by national Red Cross societies. The two officials said the ship could take letters to war prison-ers and interned civilians but only if the mail was disacted only if the mail was dispatched officially recognized prisoners whose next of kin had been noti-fied by the war department.




