Holland's Queen Lauds Press, Radio

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Queen Wilhelmina, a guest at President Roosevelt's press conference, said yesterday the contribution of press and radio to the efforts of the war leaders was of "immense value" in helping to lead mankind "toward a brighter tomorrow."

"The mission of the press and radio," she said, "is one of great responsibility—more so now than ever when the future of the world and civilization is in the balance. Its fulfillment is dependent upon freedom of speech and a free press, two conditions no dictator ever grants."

"In this country, like all the parts of my country, both rights are constitutionally guaranteed and deeply engrained in the life of the nation. Where occupation has temporarily abolished them, defeat of the enemy will see them restored."

Mr. Roosevelt, also, had mentioned the fact that the constitutions of both the Netherlands and the United States guaranteed freedom of expression and of the press, and that these rights are a fundamental part of government.

Gen. Winsor to Head N. W. Manpower Board

SEATTLE, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Appointment of Gen. H. C. Winsor, Seattle, as Washington and Oregon director for the war manpower commission was announced yesterday by William K. Hopkins, regional director.

Winsor has headed the training-within-industry branch of the war production board in the Pacific northwest and assisted in organizing the area's labor supply committees. He is chairman of the Washington committee and an ex-officio member of the Oregon and Idaho groups. Management-labor committees for the war manpower commission will be named soon in Washington and Oregon, Winsor said.

California Deer Hunting Ban Requested by Board

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The fish and game commission has recommended to the

state department of natural resources that deer hunting in northwestern California be suspended, and it appeared today the actual closing order would come probably no later than Monday.

The commission's recommendation was made at the request of the army's western defense command, although some commissioners said they saw no necessity for the closure and the entire body adopted a resolution petitioning Lieut. Gen. J. L. DeWitt to reconsider.

PORTLAND, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The Oregon Fish Protective association proposed yesterday that service men stationed in Oregon be sold hunting and fishing licenses at the rate residents pay instead of the higher rate paid by non-residents.
