

Dodgers, Yankees Win Their Games In Ninth Inning

While it may never earn them a citation from the office of defense transportation, the New York Yankees and Brooklyn Dodgers appear determined to save themselves and the baseball fans a lot of travel by keeping the 1942 World series within range of a five-cent subway ride.

Yesterday at Ebbets field, the Dodgers went to bat in the ninth inning of a scoreless pitching duel between their ace, Lefty Larry French, and Melton of the Philadelphia Phils. They loaded the bases on two singles and a walk and sent Cammill to the plate.

Cammill, however, didn't lay a bat on the ball. He merely waited out a walk which forced the winning run across, giving the Dodgers the verdict, 1-0.

Meanwhile, the Yankees went to bat against the Boston Red Sox with the score tied in the last half of the ninth. They also loaded the bases with one away and

brought up Charlie Keller.

Keller picked out a pitch he liked, slammed it for his 18th homer of the year and presented the Yankees with an 8-4 triumph. Cards Win Twin Bill

The Cards downed the Chicago Cubs twice, 9-4 and 8-3. Beazley registered his 13th pitching victory in the opener, although he yielded 10 of the 11 hits and failed to finish. The Cards coasted through in the afterpiece on 13 blows.

"Double no-hit" Vander Meer tossed a three-hitter at the Pittsburgh Pirates in a night contest which the Cincinnati Reds won, 3-0.

Earlier in the day, the Braves knocked the New York Giants loose from their hold on third place by sweeping a doubleheader, 1-0 and 8-2, ending the Giants' five-game winning streak.

Franklin's two-run single led the Detroit Tigers to a 4-2 triumph in the first game with Cleveland, and Newhouse blanked the Tribe, 2-0, on five hits in the second.

Auker pitched the St. Louis Browns to a 6-3 decision over the Chicago White Sox, but he had to be rescued in the ninth when the Sox scored all their runs.

Taylor will oppose Senator Thomas of Gooding, republican, in the November election. Thomas defeated Taylor two years ago for the unexpired term of the late Senator William E. Borah.

Gossett sent this telegram to his guitar-strumming opponent: "Congratulations, Glen. Get on your horse, come over and help me stack the hay. We'll win the general election."

Taylor campaigned by horseback and attracted crowds by singing.

Beavers, Angels Split 2; Turpin Loses in Tenth

The last-place Portland Beavers are not playing the way their Pacific Coast league baseball record indicates they should and the result is embarrassing the top Los Angeles club.

Last night the Beavers just missed sweeping a doubleheader from the Angels, who won the seven-inning opener, 5-4, in the final inning, but dropped a free-hitting second-game 6-4.

In the nightcap Portland amassed 14 safeties to 11 hits collected by the Angels.

Liska duelled Raffensberger and Davis, Angel hurlers, in the first game, as the Beavers played one of their rare error-less games. The Angels collected nine hits and the Beavers seven. Portland won on the previous night.

Looking for ways to make box lunches more interesting?

More than ever, it is imperative that the meals you serve your family be appetizing, filling, and up to nutritional standards. And that goes for a box lunch as well as any other meal of the day. In many cases (war workers on night shifts, for instance) the box lunch is the most important meal of the day. And it must not only be appetizing and nutritious, it must be planned and packed to stay attractive for hours after it's been prepared.

So don't use less of your men's planning ingenuity on box lunches—use more.

Here are a few hints and a few menus, planned and tested by the Safeway Homemakers' Bureau, that might help you in your planning.

Use the best equipment available. Be sure the tops to all jars and bottles fit perfectly. Use plenty of wax paper.

Vary the bread for sandwiches. Use the more uncommon types of bread once in a while—pumpernickel, raisin, nut bread, sesame seed, etc.

Use lots of butter. This helps keep sandwiches from drying out.

Don't include sandwiches like tomato and lettuce. They're almost certain to wilt. If he likes tomatoes, put in a whole one instead.
