Dennis Hanks of Springfield, has been in Canyonville this week looking after his business interests here and in Days Creek. His wife has been suffering from an attack of lumbago.

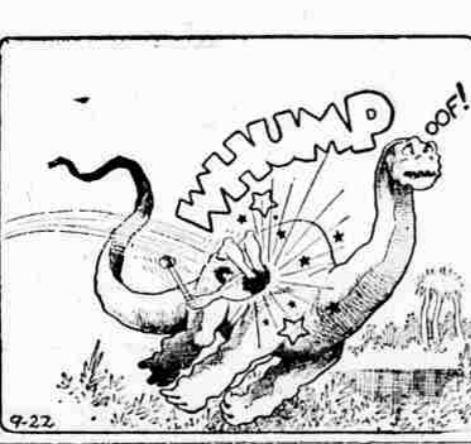
