Extending the Draft

NOW that President Roosevelt has given a green light to the step which the army has been demanding, congress is free to consider lowering the draft age to 18 years.

The army has asked for the 18 and 19-year-olds because they make the best soldiers, and in this war we need the best soldiers. Nobody who has served in the armed forces in wartime, or who has been in position to observe closely, can question that the younger men are superior in every way, except in that judgment which comes only through experience and long training.

We have millions of older men in uniform, among whom there is abundant material for leadership. Now we need men who can fight. But the president brought out another angle which is at least equally vital to those who saw American troops in action in world war I.

"Good training will save many, many lives in battle. The highest rate of casualties is always suffered by units comprised of inadequately trained men."

Nobody who realizes what we are up against in this war has any doubt that the younger men must be called into service. We face the choice, Shall we call them now, while there still is time to train them in the use of their weapons, and give them a chance to fight for their lives, or shall we draft them at the last minute, send them directly into the fighting lines and watch them die?

We are not unaware how the parents of such lads feel at a time like this. Neither is the president. One of the rare notes of emotion through his elaborate elocution when he said:

"I can very thoroughly understand the feeling of all parents whose sons have entered our armed forces. I have an appreciation of that feeling—and so has my wife."

Indeed they have, with four sons of their own in the armed forces, at least one of whom has participated in a major engagement.

But Mr. Roosevelt feels, and we believe that most parents will agree with him and with us, that the issues are too grave to permit personal reluctance to enter into this picture.

The United States needs these boys. Democracy needs these boys. They would be far, far better dead than slaves to Hitlerism, which is the only alternative to winning this war.

THE DRAFT AGE

Concerning the NORTHWEST As Viewed at the National Capital

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 22.—The mass migration of New Yorkers to the Pacific northwest is behind the aroused interest of Mayor LaGuardia of New York City in the plight of the small business man. Had LaGuardia and other prominent easterners in heavy population centers become interested in this phase of war production months ago it is quite possible that a different attitude would have been taken in this matter.

At this late date, however, with the policy of mass production in mass production centers more or less firmly established it is doubtful that the belated interest of the New Yorkers will effect any change in policy, although it may get some business for the New York clothing manufacturers who admittedly have been hard hit by curtailed civilian use and lack of sufficient government contracts to offset the drop in civilian sales.

Some New Yorkers are more worried about the distant future of their city than present conditions. These are the men who anticipate an air transportation age following the war, and if this should come to pass they feel that cities now handling most of the nation's exports and imports may lose considerable tonnage by virtue of the fact that ocean air carriers may proceed to the ultimate destination of cargo rather than land it at present seaports.

Rather than war contracts, it now seems more likely that many small enterprises will have to close in the not distant future to release men for war work. No official statements to this effect have been made, but if the policy of a large army and an arsenal for democracy is maintained the manpower will have to come from some place. Even if half of the war workers next year are women, as President Roosevelt has intimated, it appears that a manpower shortage will still exist and can only be solved by importing labor or closing non-essential industry. Study is being given now to the drafting of women for war work and the Canadian system is being studied.

Erstz for Tin Found
Mention was made in this space some weeks ago of a development by one of the independent oil companies of a tinless container for motor oil and some comment

was made as to whether this container could be used for packaging foodstuffs. It is now reported that a tinless container has been perfected by this company that can be used for packaging beer, beans and soup. The containers are processed from corn, grains, flaxseed, tallow, animal tissue, bone, clay, straw and waste paper. It is stated that this process will reduce the cost of food packaging by 40 per cent, in addition to saving millions of pounds of tin. A saving in freight cost will also result since the plastic containers are about 10 per cent lighter than tin.

Drafting And Training

Even the speedy action by congress to draft boys of 18-19 years will not prevent the drafting of married men in the east, at least, where the supply of unmarried men within the draft age is practically exhausted. Unless the tempo can be speeded up over existing procedure, selective service officials say that it will require at least 45 days after potential draftees receive their first questionnaire before they can be inducted into military service. In the District of Columbia the supply of available bachelors will not last that long. The last of the eligible single registrants will be inducted from the national capital before Thanksgiving day, it has been reported.

The army expects to get more than two million fighting men from the 18-19 year-olds. There was strong sentiment in congress to require that at least a year of training be given these youths if it could be done without crippling the administration of the act. Members still remember vividly that a number of draftees in world war No. 1 were in France before they had received more than the barest rudiments of military training. It is a known fact that untrained men suffer the greatest casualties and in this day of highly mechanized warfare the untrained man is at a still greater disadvantage.
