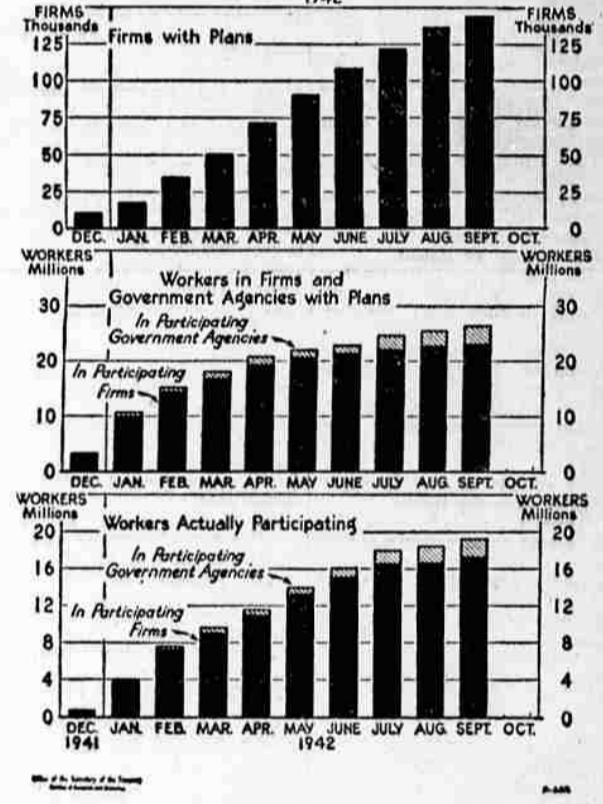
Around the County
