That a decree be made and entered that plaintiffs are the owners and entitled to the exclusive possession of all of the property herein before described; and that the defendants Pat Kieley, George Otten, Maude Nash and Fred Jobe, have no right, title or interest in or to the above described property, or any part thereof; that the deed of conveyance from the Sheriff of Douglas County, Oregon, to defendant Pat Kieley, dated December 9, 1932, and recorded on January 10, 1933, in Record of Mining Claims No. 4, at page 111, of Douglas County, Oregon, conveyed no right, title or interest in the above described property, or any part thereof, to defendant Pat Kieley; that the deed of conveyance from defendant Pat Kieley to defendant George Otten, dated December 22, 1932, and recorded on June 23, 1933, in Record of Mining Claims No. 4, at page 115, of Douglas County, Oregon, conveyed no right, title or interest to said defendant George Otten in or to the above described property, or any part thereof; that said deeds of conveyance constitute clouds upon the title of these plaintiffs to the above described property, and that both of said deeds of conveyance be declared invalid and ordered cancelled on the records of Douglas County, State of Oregon, and that the clouds thereby caused on the title of plaintiffs to said property be removed; that on July 23, 1929, and prior thereto, the said mining ground was not vacant or open to location, and the purported locations of defendant Fred Jobe are invalid and of no force or effect, and the record thereof constitutes a cloud upon plaintiffs' title; that said instruments be declared invalid and cancelled on the records of Douglas County, Oregon, and that the clouds thereby caused on the title of plaintiffs to said mining property be removed; that the title of plaintiffs to all of the property hereinbefore described be quieted and forever set at rest; that the plaintiffs be awarded their costs and disbursements in this suit; that the plaintiffs be awarded such other and further relief as to the court may be just and equitable in the premises.
