SOCIAL SECURITY LAW REVAMPING AWAITED

Editor News-Review: ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 14, 1943.—Many pension-minded people have been wondering why no action has been taken by the president on revamping the social security law and thereby also the federal pension plan, as was promised by the president in the 1940 campaign. The truth is, the president requested recommendations for revision of social security laws from the federal security office. Federal security experts prepared these recommendations and sent them to the White House. President Roosevelt, himself, handed these recommendations to Henry Morgenthau, secretary of the treasury, for their incorporation and adjustment with treasury tax policies. Morgenthau asked the ways and means committee to take appropriate action. It is understood that immediately after the last request was made of the ways and means committee, Doughton told the press his committee would not consider any further tax hearings this year and that he was opposed to further increase of social security payments until the 78th congress goes into session. So Doughton and Chairman George of the senate finance committee have pointedly closed "the door" to President Roosevelt's request that social insurance revision be taken up in the present congress. The next plan is to secure 218 congressmen to sign petitions to bring the pension bill out on the floor of the house for debate. The Johnson bill already has 309 signers and the Townsend "209" bill has 214 signers regardless of Doughton and George. Only four more signers are needed. No petition signers were required by Doughton when the congress voted for a pension for themselves because it would also pay a pension to Doughton. It depends on "whose ox is gored," but, why give two men in congress more power than 217 congressmen have? It doesn't make sense.
